Renaming Louisville's Parks

Frederick Law Olmsted's vision was brought to Louisville in the 1890's.

He believed that Nature should be integrated into urban landscapes for the benefit of all people. It is because of Olmsted's vision that Louisville has parks that improve the property value of homes, enhance the economy, support a healthy environment, and provide gathering places for all residents to come together.

To promote Frederick Law Olmsted and his vision for urban parks, and to remind Louisvillians of the value these parks bring to our city, Olmsted Parks Conservancy introduces a new name for this

great park system: "Frederick Law Olmsted Parks". While we'll always have Cherokee, Shawnee, Iroquois, and other 15 parks and 6 parkways designed by the Olmsted firm, together these works of art should bear the name of their creator.

Frederick Law Olmsted Parks: you know them, you enjoy them, you understand their value to our community. Support Olmsted Parks Conservancy and their work in restoring, enhancing and preserving our history and our future. Please visit our new website at www.olmstedparks.org.

Wilder Park Scare Special:


So if you like ghosts and want to give your heart a workout, what about taking an easy, walking tour of downtown Louisville and hearing history and mystery...and ghosts!
