

Columbine West Pool

Sounds of laughter and splashing water can now be heard as you pass by the Columbine West pool. It is open for business and everyone is having a great time. CWCA encourages residents to use the pool regularly, purchase season passes, enroll in swim lessons, join the swim team and make reservations for special events to be held at the pool after hours. The more the pool is occupied this season, the better our chances are to continue to have the pool operating. Foothills Parks and Recreation continues to evaluate the numbers closely, determining if it is cost-effective to keep the pool open. We, as a community, have the ability to make a positive impact on whether our pool stays open. It would be a huge disappointment to see the pool close down. See you at the pool!

Big Event/Dumpster Day Again a Huge Success

For the second year in a row, our expanded Dumpster Day proved to be a big hit with participants dropping off documents to be shredded, metal and electronics to be recycled, and lots of misc. trash for dumping. This year we had a dumpster delivered so we would have plenty of room for all the metal, which included a hot water heater, numerous barbeque grills, a refrigerator, washer and dryer, pogo sticks, and many, many more metal and aluminum items. We managed to stuff the dumpster full to the brim and nearly overflowing, for a total of 5,500 pounds. Proceeds from the metal recycling are used to help cover the cost of the other collection activities. Residents brought quite a few TV's, including many projection screen TV's (which take up a lot of room, are hard to dispose of, and are outdated now that flat screen TV's are popular and affordable), along with various computers and accessories. We filled the huge box truck completely full twice, which amounted to 8,196 lbs. Truck loads of wooden doors, mattresses, couches, bushes and tree branches, and fencing, among many other things, all helped to fill up the trash trucks. As a matter of fact, we filled 2 trucks, and part of a third one. And we shredded 3,600 pounds of paper, giving some residents a "sense of cleansing" to be free of the paper clutter. We used the parking lot of the Church for All Nations again this year, but were forced to make a last minute adjustment to our plans to accommodate an open house for the Aspen Creek Day Care. As it was, the adjustment really didn't have much impact on our event and we were still able to keep traffic flowing so the wait time was minimal. The only real delay we experienced was when one trash truck filled up, had to go dump, and then return. It is extremely hard to estimate how much trash residents will bring to dump. We pay for each truck we use, so if we have a third truck just standing by, if we only use part or don't use it at all, we still have to pay for it. In light of this, we contract for 2 trash trucks and if we use a third truck (one that has dumped and come back), we pay only a pro-rated amount for the portion of the truck we fill up. We appreciate the patience of those waiting for the truck to return. CWCA memberships increased by 49 members, and food donations, which were more this year than last year, were given to the Open Arms Food Bank which serves the Columbine community.

We could not have managed this event without the CWCA membership dues, which helped to fund the event, the Officers and Board Members along with other Columbine West volunteers who generously donated their time and hard work to schedule and prepare for the event, check in participants, direct and monitor traffic, and help unload. Special thanks to Rev Martino and Shiloh staff and residents who worked laboriously to unload paper, metal, electronics, and trash. Also, we thank the Church for All Nations for allowing Columbine West to use their parking lot. CWCA appreciates all the efforts to keep Columbine West a great place to live.

Re-Paving Neighborhood Streets

Columbine West residents will be seeing construction trucks in the development yet again towards the end of summer. We were able to secure a list of areas that will be impacted, so take a look and see if your street is scheduled. It looks like milling and overlaying will take place on Fremont Ave. to Webster to CDS (cul-de-sac), Roxbury Pl. from Webster to Pierce, Pierce Ct. from Roxbury Pl. to Portland Pl., Portland Pl. from Pierce Ct. to Pierce, Plymouth Pl. to Ammons to CDS, Zephyr St. to Ontario Pl. to CDS and Zephyr Ct. to Ontario Pl. to CDS. This work should be done in late August and early September. This is what is currently on the schedule but may be subject to change.

Eagle Project to Benefit Dutch Creek & Columbine West

Local Troop 459 Life Scout, Evan McCombs, will be pursuing his rank of Eagle and setting out to complete his project, which is the re-development/ landscaping on the corner of Roxbury/Webster. Evan was born in Columbine West, attended Dutch Creek Elementary and is now a Freshman at Columbine H.S. Scouting has been part of his life since joining scouts as a Tiger Cub. He inquired with Ms. Pennel, Principal of Dutch Creek, about the prospect of creating a "welcoming environment" to the corner lot, which has been increasingly neglected. Due to budget cuts throughout the Jeffco District, her response was very enthusiastic. The plot will support a variety of xeriscape plant life due to lack of water availibility. Evan needs to raise his funds for the project and has decided to offer the community the opportunity to support him. Included in the re-design, he is using Profit Resources to incorporate the installation of engraved "donor bricks," like seen on college campuses and ballparks. With a goal of 210 bricks, he will be canvassing area businesses and the community. This is an exciting project where anyone can purchase a brick and become part of the permanent installation. Attached to this article is an order form that can be filled out and sent to Evan. Deadline for submissions is **September 1st.** Please join in supporting this project that will enhance the neighborhood and help Evan to complete his advancement.
