Pat was born in Inglewood, California, and grew up in the Los Angeles area.

He has an MBA from California State University, Dominguez Hills; a Masters Degree in Recreation Administration from California State University, Los Angeles; and a BA Degree in Social Sciences from the University of California, Irvine.

At the age of 16, Pat became an Ocean Lifeguard in Huntington Beach. He went on to be the Assistant Director of the Recreational Instructional Program at UCLA, and worked for twenty-five years with the City of Paramount as the Parks and Recreational Director; Community Development Director/Executive Director of the Redevelopment Agency; and City Manager. In August 2005, he

was appointed the Director of Community Development and Executive Director of the Redevelopment Agency in Long Beach. Pat became the Long Beach City Manager in September 2007. See Page 6 for meeting details.

DREAMING OF MORE PARK SPACE, URBAN FARMING & TRAILS

For weeks, Councilmember Johnson has been taking people — residents, business owners, city officials — out to a 56-acre area he is calling *California Gardens* to promote his vision for one of the City's largest plots of land of undeveloped land in the City. This property, rich in history, contains a diverse topography, endangered species, native plants, the 2nd highest hill in Long Beach, two wetlands, and a working water basin. This water basin is part of the storm drain network that extends from the 405 freeway, makes its way into the gulch, and then flows into another pipe where it exits into the Los Angeles River. The Department of Parks, Recreation and Marine will play a role in moving the project forward. The depart-



ment is already applying for a Proposition 84 Urban Parks Grant from the state, which could be used to construct a hilltop park, hiking trails and parking. If you are interested in a tour, contact the Seventh District Office at 570-7777.


TAKIN' IT TO THE STREETS

MAKE A NOTE BRING A TOTE

Beginning August 1, 2011, retailers in Long Beach will no longer provide plastic carryout bags. Long Beach Municipal Code Chapter 8.62 To help keep Long Beach neighborhoods litter-free, the Long Beach City Council has adopted an ordinance to discontinue the distribution of plastic carryout bags by retailers. Please remember to bring a reusable tote to avoid a 10¢ fee per paper bag.

WANA meetings are open to the public and held at **Veterans Park**, 101 East 28th Street from 7-9 p.m. on the **third Monday** of every month except January, February, August & September. Because the third Mondays in January and February are holidays, we meet on the fourth Monday. In August, there is no meeting. Instead, WANA sponsors a *National Night Out to Fight Crime* Potluck on the first Tuesday in a nearby neighborhood pocket park. In September, WANA hosts an annual "Dine-Out" at a Wrigley restaurant. Board Elections are held on the third Monday in October.

Throughout the year, WANA sponsors many neighborhood events – *Halloween on the Green, Easter on the Green, Movies on the Green, National Night Out to Fight Crime* &, of course, the *Daisy Avenue Christmas Tree Lane Entertainment Nights*. Please support us by becoming a member. We hold quarterly neighborhood cleanups and serve as the Community Partner for the Friends of the Los Angeles River Annual Cleanup.
