It's time to plan your Neighborhood Cleanup and Yard Debris Day. Call Me!

There will not be a chipper but we can still accept yard debris. Please don't bring wood scraps with nails or branches larger than 6 inches around. We will not accept household garbage, concrete, roofing, household hazardous waste or any liquids (including paint!).

E-waste guidelines to keep in mind as you collect debris for the day: We cannot accept computers, TVs, monitors or laptops. These items can be recycled for free through the state-wide E-cycle Washington program. For more information about the program, visit www.ecyclewashington.org.

Thank you in advance for not bringing unacceptable items!

If at all possible, let me know at least three days in advance for the volunteer drivers to pick up your debris. We can arrange our trips a lot better that way. Remember those wonderful people are giving their time to help you. All they get in return is a "Great Big Thank You" and a cup of coffee and doughnuts. We also pay for some of their gas.

Pick up service is for senior citizens and residents with disabilities. Absolutely no items will be picked up without a resident present at the home. No exceptions will be made. Sorry we cannot be as flexible on this as we have been in the past.

Call me if you truly need help. Remember we are to help if we can but we are volunteers. We will also have extra coupons.

#### 112th Avenue Corridor Subarea Plan

The City of Vancouver will hold 2 more public workshops to hear your ideas and take your input on the future of the 112th Avenue Corridor planning area. The process will focus on how to enhance the livability of the plan area by capitalizing on the opportunities and assets and promoting strategies to overcome identified challenges.

The first public workshop held on February 8th at the Firstenburg Center went very well! We do hope that even more residents and businesses will attend the next 2 workshops (dates listed below). The goal of the Feb. 8th workshop was to identify goals, challenges and opportunities. City staff and consultants presented an overview of planned, proposed and current projects near the 112th Avenue Plan area, discussed the purpose of a subarea plan, gave examples of other successful plans, and gave an overview on the potential market when considering future potential development. A brainstorming session was held to record the participants likes and dislikes of the area, concerns and opportunities with the interchange improvements and possible future park and ride, and what features would the participants like to see in the subarea in 10-20 years. Following the group brainstorm, small groups were formed to discuss key issues and targeted questions.

There will be 2 more public workshop meetings each with different purposes and exercises. We encourage you to attend and give us your ideas and input on the future of your neighborhood.

VANCOUVER-CLARK PARKS AND RECREATION SEEKS INPUT ON NEW PARK POLICIES

The Vancouver-Clark Parks and Recreation Department, in partnership with the Public Works and General Services Departments, are seeking public comment on two new draft City of Vancouver park policies. The policies provide for expanded use of park volunteers in an "Adopt-a-Park" program and the process by which financial donations from interested citizens can support greater levels of maintenance services in city parks and facilities. In addition, the Vancouver-Clark Parks and Recreation Department has also proposed a revisions to its naming policy for both city- and county-owned park and recreation facilities.

The City of Vancouver "Adopt-a-Park" policy provides greater opportunities for citizens to support on-going maintenance and care of a local park, ballfield, trail or open space area. The program seeks a twice-amonth commitment for a minimum of six months. The tasks for the volunteers will vary based on the property to be adopted, but could include litter pick-up, weeding, raking, spreading mulch and planting flowers.

The "Donations for Park Maintenance" policy outlines the process by which the City of Vancouver will support donations by interested neighborhoods or individuals to restore park maintenance services cut as a result of 2011-12 city budget reductions. This is in response to citizen requests to personally fund the stabilization, restoration, or expansion of services to neighborhood and community parks.

The Vancouver-Clark Parks and Recreation Department is also seeking revisions to its naming policy for city and county parks and recreation facilities to better reflect current business practices.

The Vancouver-Clark Parks and Recreation Advisory Commission will conduct a first reading of the draft policies at their monthly meeting beginning at noon on Friday, March 18, at the Clark County Public Service Center Training Room 679, 1300 Franklin Street, Vancouver, WA. Public comments will be sought. The Advisory Commission will conduct a second reading and consider recommending adoption at their noon meeting on Friday, April 15, at the Clark County Public Service Center Training Room.
