#### POSSIBLE SCAM IN OUR NEIGHBORHOOD

Apparently Phoenix is experiencing a serious problem with fraudenlent people pretending to be legitimate locksmiths! These individuals are purchasing hundreds of thousands of phone numbers, often stealing the names of legitimate local lock companies, and then using fake addresses, and using real phone numbers. These "phony locksmith numbers" are routed to deceptive boiler rooms where customers are quoted very low prices, then charged fees 10 to 15 times higher than were originally quoted. These frauds are using local yellow pages, white pages, and online ads nationwide to deliberately deceive & mislead the caller. These people are not legitimate or credible locksmith!

Please use extreme caution and care when choosing a locksmith, and choose one that you personally know and trust! Check with the proper authorities, or with your local Better Business Bureau for guidance.

#### BE AWARE OF CRIMINAL INTENT

Around the area of 31st Ave & Glendale, police have reported that a couple of tactics that burglars use is to throw a rock or object thru a window, and see if someone responds, either from within, or from a neighbor; or they would knock on your door, mainly to see if anybody answers.

#### **REMINDERS:**

Neighbors, please be mindful of the bulk trash schedule, and to not put out your trash way too early, it's not fair to others, and it also creates a health and safety hazard. Thanks!

City of Phoenix regulations do not allow you to park cars on your front lawns, and leave them for long periods of time.

**Helping out a neighbor!** Our neighbors Crossroads, on 35th ave. north of Orangewood, has a monthly car was at their location, car wash only, with window cleaning; time and day of week will be posted later; cost is free, but donations are greatly appreciated, whatever you feel appropriate! (still beats the cost of a regular car wash location!) Testimonials from a couple of members have said they do a "great job"! Let's do what we can to help out our neighbors, and also graffiti helpers!!

#### WHAT IS SUSPICIOUS BEHAVIOR???

It could be a parked car, with it's engine running on a side street, with no houses facing it, or a pushy security alarm salesperson who wants to look at your current system. Maybe a bicyclist pedaling slowly as he carefully inspects the homes he passes. Or someone supposedly delivering flyers but checking out the houses in the process. Then there is the house that seems to have a lot of traffic staying only for five to ten minutes. Or a person knocking on doors to solicit contributions or whatever. Or anything else that looks a bit odd. You will know what is or isn't legitimate!

**Ocotillo Glen Neighborhood**—Bethany to Glendale, 27th to 35th Avenues


**Glen Canyon Vista**—Glendale to Northern, Freeway to 27th Avenue.

#### **SEPTEMBER**

- Solarize garden soil: prepare bed for fall planting, irrigate and then cover with clear plastic for six weeks. This will kill or drive out many of the soil pathogens. (vegetables)
- Prepare bed for fall planting. (vegetables)
- Resume full fertilizing of established roses as the weather cools. (Roses)
- Toward the end of August and into September add an iron supplement if roses show yellowing from iron deficiency. (Roses)
- Late summer application of nitrogen fertilizer probably helps fruit sizing. This is more significant for fall ripening (navels & tangerines) than spring ripening (grapefruit and Valencia orange) varieties. (fruit trees)
- Cut off spent blooms to stimulate rebloom.
- Late August or early September fertilization will benefit most plants struggling to have a flush of growth before slowing down for the winter. The growth put on before dormancy will store more energy during the winter that will be available to the plant when it pushes growth in the spring.

#### **OCTOBER**

- Watch for second season of powdery mildew (Roses)
- Cut back watering frequencies as plant needs decrease with shortening, cooling days.
- Plant winter hardy trees, shrubs and vines.
- Plant wild flowers
- Citrus fruit split—Inappropriate water management leads to sunburn, making the rind less supple and less resilient to stretching and growing, thus as the fruit starts to enlarge it splits. There is nothing to be done for this season, ensure adequate irrigation for next season.

#### Tomato foliar symptoms apparently weather-related:

The mysterious brown lesions that appeared on tomato leaves all over Central and Southern Arizona have been attributed to abiotic causes. Extensive pathological testing yielded no biological agent, ruling out bacteria, fungal and viral pathogens. The symptoms appeared shortly after the unseasonably cold and windy weather we experienced on April 9, 2011. Reports from the field indicate that most plants have grown out of the symptoms and no new lesions have appeared since the original event.

# PEOPLE LEAVE UNA MARCH MEETING FULL OF IDEAS— (courtesy of UNA)

Roberto Frietz from the city of phoenix told a story about a memorial for a rather wealthy man. As people got up to share their stories, they didn't talk about his beautiful home, his fancy cars, or his money. They recalled a man who was a caring and friendly person. The compliments could be summed up by saying, "He was a good neighbor". He would smile and say HI to people around his community, he would stop to help a neighbor, or he would offer to run errands for sick neighbors. He cared about the people who lived in his area. It made us wonder, what would our neighbors say about us? Would we just be a name or a face or would we be a real and caring person to them?

This started interesting discussions at each of the nine tables in the Palo Verde school library. Each group talked about their concerns and possible solutions. They talked about neighbors not knowing each other, blighted properties, crime and safety concerns, graffiti, traffic issues, etc.

They came up with creative ideas to help solve these concerns. Neighborhood social activities like a fair, a yard sale, block parties to increase friendliness, increased safety actions, More connections between the schools and the neighborhood, and a number of other idea for making good things happen. People left the meeting more hopeful, more enthusiastic about our future as a neighborhood and clearer on ways to make it happen.

# **IRRIGATION COURTESY**

There has been an increasing problem with irrigation flooding or shortages in the area.

Irrigation is basically just good common sense, but recent conversations with neighbors reveals not all understand the regimen necessary to operate our system.

A few simple rules will assure you and your neighbors will get their water as scheduled.

- When you sign up on the board, take only the amount you can use.
- Be sure you or someone will be responsible to take run-regardless of the time of day.
- If you fail to take all or part of your water, it builds up down the line, and eventually will flood somewhere. This will cause complaints to SRP who will shut it off temporarily. This causes others to miss their run as they don't know it's shut off until it's too late to call SRP and restart.

For some reason, I get lots of complaints and questions on irrigation-perhaps because I am first on the run, and have been around since it was all ditches! I have yet to see a complaint that the "golden rule" would not have avoided. PLEASE think of your friends and neighbors as you plan to take your irrigation allotment-we will all benefit!!

# NorthGlen Kitchen

#### YOUGURT-ZUCCHINI BREAD W/ WALNUTS

#### **Ingredients**

1 cup walnut halves (4 oz.) 2 cups all-purpose flour 1/2 teaspoon baking powder 1/2 teaspoon baking soda 1/2 teaspoon salt 3/4 cup plus 2 tablespoons sugar 2 large eggs 1/2 cup vegetable oil 1/2 cup fat-free plain Greek yogurt 1 cup coarsely grated zucchini (from about 1 medium zucchini)

#### **Directions**

- 1. Preheat the oven to 325 degrees. Butter and flour a 9 by 4 1/2 inch metal loaf pan. Spread the walnut halves in a pie plate and toast them for about 8 minutes, until they are fragrant. transfer the toasted walnuts to a cutting board and coarsely chop them, then freeze for 5 minutes to cool.
- 2. In a large bowl, whisk the flour with the baking powder, baking soda, and salt. In a medium bowl, mix the sugar with the eggs, vegetable oil, and fat-free yogurt. Add the wet ingredients to the dry ingredients along with the grated zucchini and toasted walnuts and stir until the batter is evenly moistened. Scrape the batter into the prepared pan and bake for 1 hour and 10 minutes, until the loaf is risen and a toothpick inserted in the center comes out clean. Let the loaf cool on a rack for 30 minutes before unmolding and serving.

This moist, nutty bread is a terrific way to use up late summer zucchini. The walnuts in the bread are super healthy, and the yogurt adds moisture without any fat.


