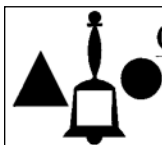

you've seen on the ESPN Great Outdoor Games the Outdoor Life Network and the Lumberjack World Championships. They travel with a completely self-contained portable lumberjack arena that assures you the most professional and eye catching show in the business. This day is designed to bring education and awareness regarding the devastation caused by the mountain pine beetle. The event will benefit the Friends of the Dillon Ranger District.

This year they have added a fun and unique addition to Beetle Fest that will be here the whole summer. Beetle Blockers Beetle Art is a public art project with 7 larger than life artistically designed beetles on display in Frisco through the summer until September 10, 2011. Two of the beetles are currently located in Breckenridge at the Riverwalk center and the Arts District. Both beetles in Breckenridge are also promoting Frisco's Beetle Fest in addition to fire mitigation education. The remaining 5 beetles are displayed throughout Frisco at the Marina, Historic Park, Visitor Information Center, Town Hall and Ollies Pub and Grub. The Colorado State Extension office is working to raise money through an auction of the beetles at the end of the summer at Beetle Fest, in Frisco.

The Yard of the Month for August is 7235 S. Yarrow St. CWCA congratulates **Tom and Gloria Koeler** for their hard work. Tom has lived in the house since 1978. It was one of the first houses built on the block. Tom has done most of the landscaping himself bringing moss rock and drift wood from their log home in the mountains. Incidentally, he built that log home himself, taking about 12 years to complete. Having had a large cottonwood tree in the yard, whose roots were growing on top of the ground, the tree was removed and dirt was hauled in. The yard was then sprayed with grass and the new landscaping began to take shape. Both Tom and Gloria are natives of the Denver area. Gloria's niece, Arianna who is 20, attends D.U. and currently resides with them due to the death of her mother. On August 29, she leaves to study English and journalism in Rome, Italy. Tom worked for King Soopers for 35 years, but since retiring he helps Gloria with her Pepperidge Farm franchise in Highlands Ranch. They enjoy spending time in their mountain home and have season tickets to the Colorado Rockies games. 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COHOPE Point of Interest

Ron Hopp, Foothills Parks and Recreation District, spoke to COHOPE on July 6th, 2011 and reported that they are selling property to developers. When Ron started in May 2008, there was a \$2.8M shortage. In 2009, there was a \$1.4M shortage. Now they have a \$1M overage. However some of this was achieved by not doing things like addressing capital and infrastructure improvements. At this time, \$45M needs have not been done. FHPRD has been fixing instead of replacing.

They are also trying to do things that generate revenue with only a small investment like putting a bar in the Ice Arena. They use the heat from compressors in the Ice Arena to heat the pools. They expect to save \$285K / year in utilities after paying for it for 10 years.

They refinanced general obligation bonds through 2026 for a reduced interest payment which will save \$1.4M over 10 years. Overhead costs have been reduced from 20% to 10.2%. They also refinanced golf revenue bonds for a savings of \$50K / year. By reorganizing, 2 positions have been eliminated. When asked "When will the next mil levy be?", Ron Hopp answered possibly November 2013 or May 2014.

FHPRD also analyzed all of their assets for what they had, what they need, and how much it costs to maintain it. Some of their real estate is not good for parks or open space. Out of 28 parcels, they found 6 that were not needed and were viable for selling. They placed the parcels with Cassidy, Turley, and Fuller. Four of these parcels may have commercial potential, while two parcels have residential potential. They hope to generate \$4.5 – 6M. The monies will be used for capital improvements, operations, or debt reduction. Their expenses are growing 3% per year. Their revenues are growing at 1.6% per year. And as property is developed, it increases their tax base and they hope to get more patrons. The six parcels were chosen because they were vacant, had marketability, had visibility, had a good location, and had development potential. The parcels have been declared as surplus. The parcel locations are:

- NE corner of W. Coal Mine Ave./ S. Wadsworth Blvd.
- NW corner of W. Coal Mine Ave./ S. Wadsworth Blvd.
- SW corner of S. Wadsworth Blvd./W. Columbine Dr.
- NW corner of S. Simms St./ S. Ward St.
- NE corner of S. Simms St./ S. Ward St.

There are no for sale signs. It is being marketed through interest and contacts.

Do You Know About Sunflowers?

Sunflower (*Helianthus annuus* L.) is one of the few crop species that originated in North America (most originated in the fertile crescent, Asia or South or Central America). It was probably a "camp follower" of several of the western native American tribes who domesticated the crop (possibly 1000 BC) and then carried it eastward and southward of North America. The first Europeans observed sunflower cultivated in many places from southern Canada to Mexico. Sunflower is an annual, erect, broadleaf plant with a strong taproot and prolific lateral spread of surface roots. Stems are usually round early in the season, angular and woody later in the season, and normally unbranched. Sunflower leaves are phototropic and will follow the sun's rays, the sunflower head is not a single flower (as the name implies) but is made up of 1,000 to 2,000 individual flowers joined at a common receptacle.

While the vibrant, strong sunflower is a recognized worldwide for its beauty, it is also an important source of food. Sunflower oil is a valued and healthy vegetable oil and sunflower seeds are enjoyed as a healthy, tasty snack and nutritious ingredient to many foods. Sunflower is an important agricultural crop choice for US

producers in the northern plains of the Dakotas to the panhandle of Texas. Taste is tops, but health and nutrition rank high for consumers who want foods that are as good for them as they are good to eat. Sunflower oil and kernels meet that challenge with their combination of health benefits and flavor. From phytochemicals and important vitamins and minerals to convenience of size and cost effectiveness, the amazing sunflower kernel is a powerhouse compared to no other! The use of sunflower oil (and other vegetable oils) as a pesticide carrier, and in the production of agricultural chemicals, surfactants, adhesives, plastics, fabric softeners, lubricants and coatings has been explored. Sunflower oil contains 93% of the energy of US Number 2 diesel fuel (octane rating of 37), and considerable work has been done to explore the potential of sunflower as an alternate fuel source in diesel engines. Blends of sunflower oil and diesel fuel are expected to have greater potential than the burning of pure vegetable oil. The sunflowers around the neighborhood have been loving the rain and the heat this summer. Drive down Webster St. from Ken Caryl Ave. and see some sunflowers that have now reached the roofline of a house.
