Another city reports using the citizenry as a part of their budget process and the revitalization of Parsons Street very similar to our Wells Street Corridor. In addition, pictures taken of Fort Wayne's "rollout" (invitation) for everyone to attend next year's conference to be held here and it was a sight to behold.

- Brent Wake presented "Bank on Fort Wayne" and it's financial education classes
- Code Dept. cut almost 6000 weed sites & in December, 30 sites will be up for demo.
- FWFD reminded not to burn leaves or park over them & keep away from drains.
- FWPD reported The Gold Wings chapter is returning here July 1-5 for a third time
- FWPD apprehended a 1 man crime wave in which 30-40 cars were broken into.
- FWPD purchased several electric cars for \$1 each to be used for short city runs.

Our guest speaker was Greg Barnes of YMCA Youth and Anti Graffiti and he described what they do and how they get it done. They often use the same vandals caught doing the graffiti in the cleanups. They operate on a \$50,000 a year budget and welcome donations of paint or money. Their office is at 1117 S Clinton and to report new graffiti sites call their hotline at 449-4747 with the location and description.

Nominations for co-chair and treasurer were taken from the floor and we will elect those officers November 17^{th} . Our largest & final attendance door prize drawing will also be then.
