

#### City of San Antonio Emergency Notification System

The City of San Antonio Notification System strives to aid in the safety of the community and increases the overall well-being of the citizens of San Antonio by keeping them informed and aware of emergency information and/or city services. The mission of the system is to augment existing public warning systems by allowing City officials to notify citizens via a variety of devices, i.e. home phone, cell phone, email, fax, and text messages. Citizens can register by telephone or internet and can select which types of notifications they would like to receive.

#### How It Works:

When a message is sent, the system will notify you in the following ways, giving you specific instructions on the current announcement:

- o Call your Home or Cell Phone with a voice recording
- o Send you a Text Message
- o Send you an Email
- o Call an alternate Phone of your choice
- o Send you a message to your Fax Machine
- o TTY/TDD devices are automatically detected on every number, there is no need to declare such devices are used.

#### EDHA Bylaws Board of Directors/Selection/ Term of Office

Section I. Number

The affairs of this Association shall be managed by a Board of nine (9) directors. Six director shall be a resident in the area he/she represents, one director from each of the six areas designated. Three directors, designated as the President, Secretary, and Treasurer shall be "at large". (Amended 10/8/07)

The El Dorado Homes Association, Inc. will be subdivided into six (6) areas of near equal number of homes and of as near homogeneous block units as possible. (Amended 10/8/07)

Section 2. Term of Office

In each even-numbered year, the membership in the evennumbered areas of the subdivision will elect one director for each area to serve two (2) years. In the odd-numbered years, the membership in the odd-numbered areas of the subdivision will elect one director for each area to serve two (2) years. The Secretary and Treasurer will be voted on by the membership at large during the annual meeting in October for a term of two (2) years. If at anytime the positions become vacant for any reason, the current Board of Directors will find a new resident to fill the vacant position. A majority vote by the Board will be required to accept the selection. (Amended 10/8/07)

The President will be elected to serve one (I) year and will be elected as President-Elect from among the Board of Directors by that Board at their first general meeting in June. (Change made 5 Oct 92) If the President-Elect chosen is a director of an area whose term is not to immediately expire, the nominating committee will include a person from that area to nominate a member to be elected to complete the unexpired term.

#### DOUBLE FRUIT FANTASTIQUE

- 1 6 oz ctn. strawberry yogurt
- 3 1/2 cu frozen whipped topping, thawed
- 1/4 cu strawberries, finely chopped
- 1 6 oz ctn blueberry yogurt
- 1/3 cu blueberries, pureed
- 1 prepared graham cracker crumb crust

Fold strawberry yogurt into half of the thawed topping; add strawberries and blend well. Spoon strawberry mixture into crust. Fold blueberry yogurt into second half of thawed topping; add blueberries and blend well. Spread blueberry mixture evenly over the strawberry mixture in the crust. Freeze until firm, about 4 hrs. Place in refrigerator about 45 minutes before cutting. Garnish as desired. Store leftover pie in the freezer (if you have any left over!)

#### **Moist Apple Caramel Cake**

Prep: 15 min. Total: 1 hour 35 min.

1 pkg (2-layer size) yellow cake mix

1 pkg (4-serving size) Jell-O Vanilla or French Vanilla Flavor Instant Pudding & Pie Filling

1 cup water

4 eggs

1/3 cup vegetable oil

3 Granny Smith apples, peeled, coarsely chopped

20 Kraft Caramels, unwrapped

1/4 cup milk

Preheat oven to 350 degrees. Grease and flour a 12-cup fluted bundt pan or a 10-inch tube pan. Beat cake mix, dry pudding mix, water, eggs and oil in large bowl with electric mixer on low speed until blended. Beat on high speed 2 min. Gently stir in apples. Pour into prepared pan.

Bake 50 min. to 1 hour or until toothpick inserted in center comes out clean. Cool 20 min; remove from pan. Cool completely on wire rack.

Microwave caramels and milk in microwaveable bowl on HIGH 1 1/2 minutes, stirring every 30 sec. until blended. Cool 10 min. until slightly thickened. Drizzle over cake.

Makes 16 servings.



### TRICK OR TREATING SAFETY TIPS

Halloween is so much fun because it's not like other nights of the year. Have fun and stay safe by following these tips:

#### See and Be Seen

After dark, kids aren't usually swarming the neighborhood. But on Halloween night, they are. That's why kids need to watch out for cars and other traffic. Be sure that your mask or costume doesn't cover your eyes or make it tough for you to see where you're going. You might think about wearing makeup instead of a mask. If you do wear a mask, make sure the eye holes are big enough that you can see. Kids also need to be seen on Halloween, so it's a good idea to wear or carry something that glows in the dark. You might choose a glowing necklace, a glow-in-the-dark treat bag, or a flashlight. Your parents also can apply reflective tape to your costume.

#### Don't Go It Alone

It's best to trick-or-treat with family members or friends. And it's also a good idea to have a grownup with you. A cell phone can be another handy item to have along. That way, you can check in with a parent or call for help, if needed.

Talk it over with your mom or dad when you're deciding where to trick -or-treat. Sticking close to home is great because then you'll know many of the people and you won't get lost in unfamiliar neighborhoods. And people who already know you just might throw an extra treat in your bag!

When trick-or-treating, avoid going inside a stranger's home. Sometimes a person might invite you in for a treat, but you can just say that your mom or dad asked you not to go inside anyone's house. (Likewise, never go up to or into a stranger's car even if the person

offers you a Halloween treat.)

And if you're wondering about whether to go to a certain house, check if the porch light is on. If not, that's usually a sign that they aren't home or they don't want any trick-or-treaters.

#### Don't Trip!

You want your costume to look cool, but there's nothing cool about tripping and stumbling all Halloween night. Make your costume tripproof by:

- making sure it's not too long
- wearing shoes that fit
- avoiding swords, canes, and other props that can get in your way.

#### Let's Talk Treats

Before you start eating the treats in your bag, you'll want to get a good look at them. When you get home, dump everything out and let your mom or dad see what you have. They can help you get rid of stuff you shouldn't eat. For instance, you don't want to eat anything that's loose or not in a wrapper. Anything unwrapped, including fresh fruit, should be thrown away. Without a wrapper, it's hard to tell if food is clean and safe to eat.

Once you've looked over your treats, you'll probably wonder just how much you can eat. Well, it's best not to overdo it. If you don't eat too much on Halloween, you'll have leftovers to enjoy in the days and weeks to come. In other words, you can make Halloween a little sweeter by making it last a little longer!


