Are you ready to talk some trash?? Didn't you know that's a good thing?!





# **Animal Alert!**

Uninvited House Guests by Bonnie Bradshaw, 911 Wildlife

Here are the top five ways to prevent squirrels, raccoons, opossums and skunks from moving into your home during the winter:

1. Don't provide a midnight buffet. Birdseed, pet food and table scraps attract wildlife from miles away. Only put the amount of birdseed in your feeder in the morning that will be completely consumed before dusk. Don't leave pet food or unsecured garbage outside overnight. And if you have a pet door, close it at night by sliding a template in place to cover the entrance.



squirrels and other wildlife. Loose shingles are the equivalent of a flashing "Vacancy" sign for wildlife. Carefully inspect your roof and eaves. Repair deteriorating boards, warped siding and damaged shingles. Cover attic openings with heavy gauge, rustproof wire mesh (not chicken wire). If you have a chimney, make sure that it has a secure cap. Chimneys without caps are open invitations to raccoons looking for "hollow trees" in which to give birth and raise their young.


- 3. Don't forget your friends in low places. If you have a pier-and-beam foundation, cover vent openings with heavy gauge, rustproof wire mesh. If you have a deck, install an L-shaped barrier around it -- dig a trench 12 inches deep and 8 inches wide around the perimeter of the deck, line the bottom of the trench with heavy gauge wire mesh, bend it 90 degrees up, attach the wire mesh to the base of the deck with screws and washers and then backfill. This barrier will permanently prevent animals from digging underneath a deck or shed.
- 4. Don't waste time and money. If you're hearing strange noises from your attic and you suspect that furry guests already have moved in, call 911 Wildlife at 214.368.5911 to humanely evict and permanently exclude them. Wildlife can damage electrical wires, cause water damage, stain ceilings, destroy attic insulation and create unpleasant odors. If you hear scratching or gnawing sounds, it's important to get expert advice and take action immediately. Don't waste time and money on traps or home remedies that can make the problem worse.
- 5. Spread the word. Share this information with your neighbors so they don't end up with uninvited guests.
