NOW AVAILABLE TO LINDEN NEIGHBORHOOD RESIDENTS

We want to make you aware of two grants available through Gladstone's Neighborhood Commission.

1. Weatherization Grant

Monies were set aside to help local residents reduce their utilities by improving their home's insulation.

2. Gravel Driveway Replacement Grant

The purpose of this grant is to enhance our older neighborhoods through the replacement of existing gravel driveways with concrete or asphalt. This grant is for a maximum of \$3000 per home.

The Gladstone Neighborhood Commission currently has money available for both of these projects. All applications will be reviewed and approved on a first come first serve basis.

There are some income restrictions on both grants.

These monies may go away if we do not make use of them.

SHEPHERD'S CENTER OF THE NORTHLAND

Last month Shepherd's Center presented our program. I don't think most of us had any idea the impact they have on seniors North of the river.
