#### LETTER FROM THE PRESIDENT

# Internationally Publicized Winter Wonderland over in UNA (courtesy of UNA)

Last year 16,000 adults and kids visited 4237 W. State between Thanksgiving night through New Year's Day during the evening between 6pm to 10pm. Some even arrived in double-decker buses.

The attraction? For 17 years David Chuchla puts his furniture in storage in July, and begins the massive transformation to convert the interior of his house, as well as the front and back yards, with more than 60 trees and over 100 animated figures into a winter wonderland! He never charges anyone to see his incredible collection, but does appreciate donations to help pay for his electricity bill.

He has been recognized Valley wide. He has won the Best Decorated House in the Valley. Fox-10 TV did the weather from his house, and every local TV channel has covered his place. Both the New Times and the Arizona Republic have reported on it.

It isn't just local recognition that he has received. Martha Stewart included his house in "Homes Across America". Both Life and Time have covered it in their magazines. Publications as far away as Japan have mentioned this place as worthy of seeing in Phoenix during the month of December.

**D**avid's passion for Christmas decorations started at a very young age. He recalls at the age of five, he "went to Cobo Hall in Detroit to see their huge Christmas displays", and became hooked for life!

His collection of holiday and winter items keeps growing through donations. "Year round people drop off boxes of ornaments", David says, "One man decided to donate his 12 foot tall, \$1200 tree rather than take it with him when he moved." But, he admits he is a "Christmas nut" and shops all year round for items.

**D**avid is sensitive to the impact of his passion on his neighbors. He puts out trashcans for visitors, and walks the street to make sure there is no trash left behind. He told us he waits until the last minute to put up the outside decorations, and to make sure it is all gone by New Year's Day in consideration of the neighbors.

#### **SNICKERDOODLES**

Ingredients

2 cups all-purpose flour
1/2 teaspoon baking soda
1/4 teaspoon salt
Large pinch of grated nutmeg
1/2 cup unsalted butter, at room temperature
3/4 cup sugar

1 egg 1 egg yolk

1 teaspoon vanilla extract
1 teaspoon finely grated lemon or orange rind
2 teaspoons ground cinnamon, to coat

**Directions** 

Preheat the oven to 375 degrees F. Prepare two baking sheets by brushing with melted butter

Sift together the flour, baking soda, salt and grated nutmeg. Cream together the butter and sugar and add the egg, egg yolk, vanilla and lemon or orange rind. Beat until light and fluffy. Add the shifted ingredients and mix well. Scrape down the sides, cover the bowl with a piece of plastic wrap and refrigerate for 30 minutes. Mix the cinnamon and sugar together in a small bowl.

Using a teaspoon, scoop up small amounts of the dough and roll them into balls about 1 inch in diameter. Roll the balls in the cinnamon sugar and use enough to fill the prepared baking sheets, spacing about 2 inches apart. Slightly flatten the balls and bake for about 12 minutes, or until the cookies are just starting to brown around the edges and slide easily from the baking sheet. Cool on a wire rack. Repeat with the remaining mixture, preparing the sheets as in step 1.

Chef's Tip: if you are baking more than one sheet of cookies in a non-convection oven, swap them around halfway through to make sure they cook evenly.

ACTIVE TIME: 15 minutes TOTAL TIME: 1 hour
