

Beacon Hill is a Conservation District in the City of San Antonio.




As residents get ready for the new year, the Solid Waste Management Department wants to send a friendly reminder to residents about all of the items that can be recycled. Recycling doesn't have to be a chore, it's easy to do and it can be fun too. In the City's recycling program you just have to remember a few simple steps.

1. Most types of paper can be recycled. So feel free to throw items such as: newspapers



ad circulars
magazines
cereal boxes
paper towel cores
paper bags,
telephone books
non-metallic gift wrap

- 2. Glass bottles and jars of all colors. All you need to do is remove the lid and rinse all the food and liquid from them then they are ready to be recycled.
- 3. Plastics. When it comes to plastic containers you want to look for the numbers one through seven in the center of the recycling symbol. If you see that, then it can be recycled.


Please Note: Any person requesting to present formally to the community at the general meeting must submit. their request to the secretary at least 24 hours before the meeting to be placed on the agenda. The time allowed for presentations, unless decided by the Board

Just as you did in the steps to the left, make sure it is clean before throwing in the blue cart.

- 4. Metal cans. Just like with glass you want to be sure they are clean but if it is metal or aluminum or even steel, it can be recycled.
- 5. Milk, juice and soup containers are now accepted in your blue recycling cart!

Remember no plastic bags, food, clothes hangers, grass clippings, wet waste or packaging styrofoam belongs in the blue recycling cart.

Animal Control



Art Beat By Dara Anderson Interview with Cee Jav Black

Although Cee Jay Black has a wide range of creative impulses exhibited by her studies in journalism, film, radio (she was a DJ at KSYM), art and design, she has always had a love for designing jewelry. Cee Jay makes jewelry the old fashioned way, piece by piece, fabricated by hand. She brings artisanal techniques to beautiful, avant-garde, one of a kind objects.

5 questions for Cee Jay:

What is your artistic background that led you to designing jewelry?

I grew up surrounded by artists in the Black Stain Glass Studio. Even as a child I was interested in the creative processes of drawing and design. I was fortunate to be encouraged to be imaginative and original. I went to art camp at the McNay. I had a neighbor who made jewelry and I became fascinated with making unusual pieces. I wanted my jewelry to be striking not just what was the fad of the moment! That is still my objective.

Is it more important to start with a beautiful stone or to start with an idea? Do you sketch it out?

Yes to all of that. Sometimes I will keep a stone or beads for years before I find the perfect complement for it. I like to use semi-precious stones and metals, sometimes pieces of fused glass or pottery. My intent is that these components all work together to form a piece that looks both natural and striking.

What inspires you?

My faith and nature-especially under water marine life. I am inspired by natural elements. For instance my daughter found a rock that is shaped like a heart and has striations that look like it has been sewn together. I love that!

What is your goal for your jewelry making for the next year?

I am working on a space at my home to set up my metal smithing tools and start using a new kiln for glass. A home studio, in other words.

Will you be showing at the On-Off Fred. Road tour?

Yes, my studio at BH Presbyterian Church will be open and I will have new pieces to show.

Meeting called to order at 7:05 PM by Everett Ives. He presented the agenda and made changes to add discussion of 1027 Aganier and it was adopted by consensus.

- 1.Mark Reyna, Congressman Doggett's office. Redistricting changed again still may be running in San Antonio
- 2. Code officer Richard Zertuche, introduced Marc Castro on new property code changes. Field office on Dora St. New Code Compliance Officer Gloria Gutierrez will take over our area temporarily.
- 3. Cosima Colvin read Treasurers report.
- 4. Lincoln Avant gave a District 1 update for Councilman Diego Bernal, Linear park update they are working with Alma working on shade structure to find money. Request for speed humps and stop signs on Elsmere denied by city. He is working on getting probationers to help with fence at Community Garden. D1 is also involved in working out issues on "halfway house" on Aganier.
- 5. Cosima Colvin gave HD123 report for State Rep Mike Villarreal. New program SA Serves provides reader buddies and mentoring of at risk kids help high schoolers with financial aid research and filling out forms. - 6. Dara Anderson reported for Heart of the Neighborhood on the Christmas party pot luck success. announced that HON needs help on the garage sale coming up. - 8. MaryAnn Van Ness gave the ZUD (Zoning and Urban Design) report see page 4 in Jan newsletter.
- 9. Marc Castro Code Compliance gave a talk on updated minimum property maintenance code. Highlights include but are not limited to: owner must have electricity and heating. Pool and hot tub must be enclosed. Smoke detectors are required. A fence cannot lean more than 15 degrees. He also spoke on property hazards and surface hazards. There is a new appeals process and also a Building Standards Board to deal with DSDB type properties new board is council appointed and mayor and 3 at large We will print in the newsletter a web address for getting all of this information. Additional discussion on code enforcement: Citizens can now become volunteer code rangers and graffiti rangers fill out application and they will be used for patrolling hot spots like known dumping areas 20 most dumped in areas Rangers will pick up bandit signs, inventory vacant lots....and for Graffiti they will be able to check out a van and go abate graffiti. There is an orientation held every 4 months and this is on the Code Compliance website.


Free Money! Well, almost.

The 17th Annual Basura Bash San Antonio Waterways Clean Up is scheduled for Saturday, February 25, 2012 from 8 a.m. – Noon. Last year's clean up resulted in a total of 35.5 tons of trash, 8.9 tons of tires, and 2.5 tons of metal being collected from the San Antonio river and area waterways. Approximately, 2,606 volunteers cleaned 15 waterways that impact the San Antonio River watershed. WE NEED YOU TO BE ONE THIS YEAR!

This is a perfect activity for church youth groups, boy and girl scouts, or employers looking for a community service project. Certificate of hours completed are available.

The Martinez Creek traverses Beacon Hill (along I-10 and in the area near the linear park and community garden) and feeds into the San Antonio River. 

SAISD and Alamo Stadium

The recent situation with our San Antonio Independent School District (SAISD) is very troubling. We start with the very successful November 2010 \$515 million dollar bond issue. One of the items we voted on was to renovate Alamo Stadium for use of the students.

Prior to the bond election, however, discussions were being held between the Spurs, Sports & Entertainment (SS&E) group and SAISD officials for SS&E's use of the renovated Alamo Stadium for professional soccer.

Discussions were abruptly terminated before the election when many voters opposed this possibility.

However, in early 2012 the SAISD Board was set to vote for the removal of the track at Alamo Stadium, which is a necessity for a FIFA pro-soccer playing field. There were deep objections to this action and many people showed up on January 5th to make their concerns known to the board. Among objections were:

SAISD and Alamo Stadium

- 1. Public trust Nowhere in the 2010 bond issue ballot did we vote for use of Alamo Stadium for professional soccer.
- 2. If the track at Alamo Stadium is removed the district will have to find and pay for another venue for the students to use for track.
- 3. There is a deed restriction for Alamo Stadium stating that there can be no professional sports played there. If an agreement/contract for pro-soccer is entered into there is a group of nearby residents ready to file a lawsuit. In the past they have successfully done this.
- 4. Quality education should be the number one goal; not prosports.

No vote was taken on January 5th but the issue returned on January 9th. Again many citizens offered strong testimony against Options that would open the opportunity for prosports. Superintendent Robert Duron, the person in charge of SAISD athletics, and the Citizens Oversight Committee [which had been appointed to gain public trust] ALL recommended only renovation of Alamo Stadium - no pro sports preparation. Against all objections, the board voted to keep the track but to still develop a "FIFA playing field." Only Patti Radle and Carlos Villarreal voted No.

After much public opposition, on January 18th Chairman Ed Garza was quoted in the Express as follows: "I believe the focus and the attention by the potential use of the stadium by (Spurs Sports & Entertainment) needs to be taken off the table," Garza said.

With that things have quieted down, but because of the lack of trust on what may occur in the future, I, for one, will not believe the SS&E and pro-soccer is gone until the board rescinds the vote. The only people who can accomplish this are Chairman Garza and Trustees Ruben Cuero, James Howard, Olga Hernandez and Adela Segovia who voted Yes. Hopefully, the vote will be rescinded and the board can go about the business of renovation and not transformation of Alamo Stadium and most importantly, their main emphasis will be the quality education of our children.
