


We have been working hard this winter improving our association. With our new website we will be able to post neighborhood news faster and with more detail.

During colder months, it is common for people to leave their vehicle running to "warm it up" before leaving. Because of this, the FWPD receives numerous calls regarding stolen vehicles. Please avoid leaving your car while it is running, even if only for a few minutes.

Locking your car is always the best solution. If you make it easy for someone to get in, they will most likely take advantage of this.

Control your keys. Only leave the keys necessary for repair shops to do their job. Or, have a spare key made that says "Do Not Duplicate" just for this purpose.

When possible, park in well-lighted, busy areas and close to buildings with windows.

Buy and install a car alarm.

If your vehicle is older, have the door locks replaced with tapered ones. These are more difficult to "Jimmy".

Take your keys with you when going in to pay at convenience stores/fuel stations.

Avoid parking in between larger vehicles, which may obscure surveillance on your vehicle.

Periodically check your license plate to ensure that it is still present.

Avoid hiding or intentionally leaving a spare key inside the vehicle.

Use a product to lock the steering wheel. Although these can be easily defeated in most cases, it is one more deterrent they have to contend with. More than likely, they will find an easier target. Locks that engage both the steering wheel and one of the pedals are preferred.

If you have a garage, use it. Keep the door locked.

When going out of town, disconnect the battery or remove the electronic ignition fuse.

Consider anti-theft devices such as fuel shut-off, kill switches. or electronic chip keys.

Like Operation I.D., record the following information and keep it in a location other than the vehicle:

Make and Model

Model Year

Registration (plate) number


Vehicle Identification Number (VIN)

Color

Any specialties such as bumper stickers, dents, paint variations, etc.

Free Tax Help until April 24, 2012. Income must be under \$50,000.00 Have direct deposit with your bank or receive a check by mail and file electronically. Filers must have a picture ID; Social security cards or ITIN numbers for everyone in the family; W2's, Unemployment and 1099 forms; for renters, the name and address of the landlord; for homeowners, property tax information; child care expenses, you will need name, address and Social Security number of the provider; bank account information; and if possible, a copy of your 2010 tax return.







To Navigate our new website read information below.

Click on any one of the links, Home, Our Info, Discussions, Calendar, Pages & Links and Meet Your Neighbors will each open a different window. There are other links throughout the pages so watch for underlines, they are usually links.

- **Home** is where you sign in. It is located under the new logo. If you are just visiting, click your way around the site. If you desire to become a member of the website you will be prompted to create a user name, a password and your email address. (You can be assured your email can only be accessed by the administrator and used for association business)
- Our Info shows Bloomingdale's boundaries map and other information.
- **Discussions** is where to start a discussion or post a reply. This is a good pulse of the neighborhood area. Feel free to start a thread. As neighbors get use to checking into the site there will be more activity.
- Calendar is just that. Dates, times, place, links e.g. If you desire not to post something, feel free to email the administrator.
- Pages & Links has two columns; Documents & Pages and External Links. Pictures, links and announcements will be found under Documents & Pages. The External Links will have useful links just a click away.
- **Meet Your Neighbor** is all our members of the website. Click on their name or picture which will bring up another window for Bio Details. Any personal details you have to type in or leave blank if you wish.
- Our Info, right upper corner, click on the Google map to see a larger map of our neighborhood boundaries in respect to the city streets.
- Our Info—same as on the top row of areas.
- Contact—is where you find our officers, email addresses and links.
- Newsletter—newsletter archives. The format is PDF and you can save or print out a hard copy for your own use. In the future, this is the only way you will get a paper copy of the newsletter. The only exception will be the resident without an internet connection and request a printed copy from the association.
- Map—the larger Google map.
- Our Neighbors—link to the larger page.
- Add Yourself—Registration or Sign In.
