Happy Spring to all! I hope you all have been enjoying the blooms in our Bloomingdale neighborhood. A bit earlier than the usual the trees have shown us their colorful side and the spring flowers remind us vividly that summer is around the corner. With the early warm temps, the "itch" to plant is on! Keep in mind, that in our area the frost dates still run from mid-May to mid-October .lf you are an early planter watch those temperatures at night and cover tender plants as needed. Spring is also the important time for clean up and preparation. With this in mind, here are some things to think about.

Rake up and clean around, shrubs, borders, and beds etc. This is important because leftover debris can carry disease and insect issues later on.

PULL weeds in beds when possible. This aids in keeping the use of weed killers to a minimum. You just made your first step to going "green"!

Trim off all dead leaves, canes, stalks etc. to make airflow for new growth. If you plan to trim bushes and shrubs (or anything else you might want to cut back), first check to see when that particular variety needs to be pruned. Some may need it in winter, some in spring, and yet some right after blooming . This is important because different plants have different times they start to form blooms. If you cut them at the wrong time, you may be cutting off the already forming blooms for next year! (This is especially true of Hydrangeas. Different species need to be cut at different times. Ever wonder why you didn't get blooms on them?)

Check your wood chips or mulch media for molds or anything else that looks suspicious. Discard damaged materials. (Tired of the color of your wood chips? Now is the time you can change things up, by adding a new different color.)

Loosen soil before planting. Plants will not grow well in compacted soil. This is also the time to add new soil or to amend your existing soil. Remember the quality of the soil is the key to the quality of your plants!

Spring and fall are the best times to re-do your lawn or fix bare spots. If using seed, remember to keep it watered well till seeds germinate and take hold.







Bloomingdale has 3,415 peopleor 1% of Fort Wayne's population.


Bloomingdale's Walk Scoreis 30 points higher than Fort Wayne's Walk Score of 39.
