## **Fires, Fireworks & 4th of July**

**Open burning, private use of fireworks banned in Colorado.**

DENVER – Thursday, June 14, 2012 – Gov. John Hickenlooper today signed an Executive Order that bans open burning and private use of fireworks throughout Colorado because of very dry conditions and high fire danger. Commercial, professional and municipal fireworks displays are allowed when written approval has been granted by the sheriff of the county in which the fireworks display is to occur.

“We can’t completely eliminate the threat of wildfire because there’s no way to control Mother Nature,” Hickenlooper said. “But we can take steps to reduce the risks of more wildfires starting. This ban is a necessary step to help protect people, property and the beautiful state we live in.” Conditions around the Front Range and in our neighborhood make it very likely that fireworks could start fires. Last year we had a small front yard fire at a home, some young kids were playing with bottle rockets and a number of evergreen bushes caught on fire. With quick action from neighbors, the fire was contained to just one yard. Remember that ANY fireworks that leave the ground are “illegal” and the authorities can issue a ticket. Independence Day should be a day of reflecting on our nations freedoms, not on trying to contain an out-of-control fire.

Due to elevated fire conditions, a fire ban has been implemented for specific portions of unincorporated Jefferson County, to include all federal land. This ban is in effect June 7, 2012 at 12:00 p.m. Along with the fire ban, the fire restrictions already in place will remain effective.

Traditionally, there is confusion over what is allowable when the county is under a fire ban and/or fire restrictions. The FAQs’ below address much of this confusion.

Check them after walks and pay attention if you see excessive licking of their paws. Check your feline friends too if they spend anytime outside roaming the streets.

**Am I in a fire ban or under fire restrictions?** You are in a fire ban if you are located west of C470, west and south of the intersection of Wadsworth Blvd. and C470, or west of Highway 93. You are under fire restrictions if you are east of C470, east and north of the intersection of Wadsworth Blvd. and C470, or east of Highway 93.

**What is allowed in a fire ban?** Only devices that are liquid fueled or gas fueled are allowed. Simply put, gas grills, gas fire pits, gas stoves, and gas lanterns are allowed. The rule of thumb is whether or not the fire can be "turned off," rather than "put out."

**What is allowed under fire restrictions?** Charcoal grill fires at private residences or within a permanently constructed grate in a developed park, campground, or picnic area. Any fires contained within liquid fueled or gas fueled stoves, lanterns or heating devices. Legal fireworks provided that all combustible material is adequately cleared. Fireworks Hotline: 303-271-8025.

Jefferson County deputies will strictly enforce the temporary fire ban and temporary fire restrictions in the unincorporated areas, to include federal lands. Pursuant to County Policy Part 3, Chapter 6, Section 2, authorizing the Declaration of Open Fire Bans, violations of these prohibitions, upon conviction, is punishable by a fine of not more than \$600.00. Such act(s) violate section(s) 102.8 and/or 308.2.1 of the International Fire Code.

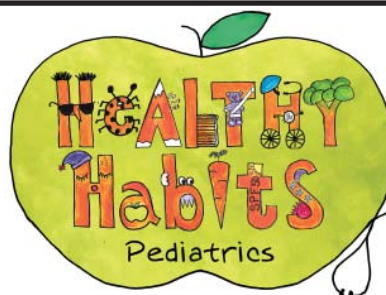

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## Update on Dumpster Day

The 3rd Annual Dumpster/Recycling Day 2012 was the most successful event Columbine West has ever had. Approximately 177 homeowners started lining up at 7:30a.m. to have documents shredded, metal and electronics recycled, and loads and loads of trash compacted in trash trucks. There were quite a few of them who ended up making multiple trips. Pro Disposal filled 4 trash trucks with fencing, tree branches, bushes, mattresses and many assorted items that amounted to 40 tons or 80,000 lbs of trash. MeTech filled a large box truck with televisions, computer monitors and towers, and other electronics for a total of 7,191 lbs. The metal dumpster, provided by All Recycling, was heaping full, weighing in at 5,020 lbs. Our collection site even overflowed into the church parking lot. Xpresshred shredded 4500 lbs of documents on site as residents watched their confidential documents shredded right before their eyes. The amount of broken, out dated or useless stuff that came from garages, basements, and backyards was truly amazing. CWCA membership grew by 56, a combination of new members and renewals. Membership dues and proceeds from the metal recycling are used to fund this event.

Volunteers made up of CWCA Officers and Board Members, community members, and Shiloh House boys and counselors worked together to set up, check in vehicles, and unload all the stuff. Our traffic director kept the line for the dumpsters moving very efficiently, even as we unloaded (2) cut-up hot tubs. That's right, hot tubs. During this time the Shiloh volunteers and others went from vehicle to vehicle unloading metal and electronic items. The young men made the day more fun with their endless

energy. They were even showed how to operate the trash truck crushing mechanisms. All went as planned, with the exception of the document shredding who showed up an hour late, but soon caught up with all the documents that had been dropped off to be shred. Best of all, we had a record year for food donations. We dropped off the numerous boxes the following week to the Open Arms Food Bank, which supplies food to those in need, in the Columbine community. They were ever so grateful to receive the generous outpouring of food. The mutual friendship we have allowed us the use of the Church for All Nations parking lot again this year. The lot provides us with the space to accommodate the event without negatively impacting the surrounding area. This event really helps our community clean and spruce up by offering a one-stop drop-off site close by. We wish we could offer a hazardous waste drop as part of this event, but Jefferson County does not offer on site hazardous drop-offs. They do offer at home service for \$30 or drop off service at their Rooney Road location for \$20. 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## Target Shooting on Public Land

This month's Behind the Badge is brought to you as a result of numerous calls and complaints regarding the discharge of firearms. Shooting is generally allowed on public lands except in developed recreation sites or areas.

### Shooting is allowed on public lands as long as the activity:

Does not create a public hazard, nuisance, or direct threat to public safety. This includes shooting any weapon from, across, or toward any road or trail, regardless of the road or trail surface, shooting in an unsafe manner, or shooting in an unsafe direction.

Does not damage or destroy natural features, native plants, cultural resources, historic structures or government/private property. This includes using any vegetation or structure as a target, backstop, or target holder.

Does not facilitate and create a condition of littering and abandoned personal property. The shooting of any glass or material that would break into small pieces and create a hazard or litter is prohibited. All spent shells or brass are considered litter as well.

In addition you must not possess or discharge a firearm in violation of any Colorado State Law. This includes possession of a firearm while under the influence of alcohol or a controlled substance and carrying a concealed weapon in violation of state law.

### Location, Location, Location

Ranges are ample in the Denver Metro area and listed by the Colorado Parks and Wildlife. Jefferson County also offers target shooting in public lands under the aforementioned conditions. Click here for a map of 'no-shot' areas in Jefferson County.

### Safety

- ALWAYS keep the gun pointed in a safe direction
- ALWAYS keep your finger off the trigger until ready to shoot
- ALWAYS keep the gun unloaded until ready to use
- Know your target and what is beyond
- Know how to use the gun safely
- Be sure the gun is safe to operate
- Only use the correct ammunition for your gun
- Wear eye and ear protection as appropriate
- Never use alcohol or over-the-counter, prescription or other drugs before or while shooting
- Store guns so they are not accessible to unauthorized people
- Always use a proper backstop when target shooting
- Pick up your cartridges, shells and target when finished
- Be mindful of your target: shooting glass is considered littering
