

A MESSAGE FROM YOUR PRESIDENT

CONDO LIVING - II

In the April issue of the CHATTERBOX, I indicated that every owner is a co-investor of this community. With ownership come equal rights and among those rights are: (1) the right to attend meetings; (2) the right to speak in debate; (3) the right to vote for representation and; (4) the right to hold office.

Unfortunately, few residents exercise their right to attend meetings, and I can readily understand the reluctance...meetings can be boring, time-consuming, and non-productive. Many people get caught up in the "minutia of the moment" and lose their focus of the matter at hand. Oftentimes procedure impedes common sense and good judgment in the resolution of business. However, meetings allow for a forum where a Board can provide and disseminate information on issues, collect feed-back from owners, and make intelligent decisions on how to best resolve problems.

A number of people are hesitant about stating their opinions or viewpoints on issues although they have the right. A simplified version of "Roberts Rules of Order" is used for procedural guidelines so that business can be conducted in an orderly fashion and in most instances a speaker will be allowed 3 minutes to express his/her thoughts. It's not important whether a person is in favor or has an opposing viewpoint on a matter; it is important, though, for everyone to make a thoughtful contribution to the discussion and that it's made ALWAYS in the best interests and welfare of the entire community, not in the self-interest of the individual.

We live in a democratic society where the majority rules. The majority of a Board is considered a quorum, unless a greater number is specified in an Association's by-laws or by statute. Board members should act in good faith at all times. Boards of directors and officers have a fiduciary relationship to its members; an obligation of trust and confidence is imposed when one

serves as Board member. Each year elections are held to select those best qualified (presumably) and who are willing to assume responsibility. People serve voluntarily and without compensation. You have the right to elect those individuals whom you believe will best represent you and who will best serve the welfare of our community.

Where (and how many times have you heard this before): "Serving as a director or more specifically as an officer is a thankless job." There is an innate belief there is goodness in the hearts of people, and for the most part that is true. From the day I accepted the job as president of Building 1 and subsequently as president of this complex, I have been reminded of Thomas Paine's words written some 236 years ago: "These are the times that try men's souls."

I can hardly liken my role to the issue of the fight for freedom and independence; in fact, it would be folly to even remotely consider there might be a comparison. Those who are in charge set themselves up for criticism...it's a hazard of the occupation. As Thomas Paine went on to say in his essay: "...the harder the conflict, the more glorious the triumph." The distinct satisfaction in leading this community has been the praise from so many residents about the accomplishments that have taken place without the inherent financial burdens. The nicest compliments have been the ones that tell me, "The place looks as good, if not better, than it did 33 years ago."

How wonderful it would be to hear words of encouragement and support at a Board meeting! Meeting dates and times for your individual buildings, as well as the Club, are posted on your bulletin boards and in the CHATTERBOX. Help us by accentuating the positive and eliminating the negativity and choose to become a leader and glow in your own achievements...you have the right to serve!

Tribute to a Mother

If you looked in the encyclopedia under "fine English lady" you would probably see a picture of Queen Elizabeth. If you looked in the encyclopedia under "fine English lady with a golden heart" surely a picture of Edith von der Hayden would appear. Love and devotion to family and friends is what personifies this fine English lady.

Edith was born the year World War 1 ended, on April 21, 1917 in Camden, New Jersey to English immigrants Leonard and Amy Schofield. She attended school in Camden, graduating from Woodrow Wilson High School and attended beauty school to become a hairdresser. Although she never worked in that field, she always enjoyed working with hair in later years. She worked for Outdoor Advertising until she met the love of her life, Edward von der Hayden, and knew early on that he would be in her life for many years to come. In fact, they were engaged just a few short months after meeting. Married on October 21, 1938 she and Ed lived a pretty typical life of the of the time. Living in an upstairs apartment in Woodbury, N.J., Edith often talked about baking a cake and finding the cake pan empty the next morning. When Ed returned home from working the night shift that cake must have looked pretty darn good.

Edith gave birth to two loving daughters, Arlene in 1940 and Gail in 1945. Her life became about caring for her family. Whatever her girls had an interest in became her interest as well. Living in Woodbury for all those years, enjoying raising her family in small town America, what could be better? Edith taught her girls by example. Her sweet nature in caring for her father when he became ill after suffering a stroke taught her about being a daughter. Her love and devotion for her husband taught her girls about being a wife. Her natural gift of motherhood taught her about being a mother. Ultimately, when she became a grandmother her tireless efforts in spending time with her grandchildren, Blake, Amy and Corey, taught her family the joys of being a grandmother. Today she enjoys her great grandchildren, Owen and Lucy. And how lucky her family was and still is to have her as their matriarch as she celebrates her 95th birthday.

She was there for the birth of each grandchild to help where needed but never critical or judgmental, always in the background with love and encouragement. Her sons-in-law struck gold with Edith and always appreciated her sense of boundaries. Today her adopted son, Bob Marconi, would surely echo that sentiment.

Before Edith and Edward retired to Florida, Edith



When her beloved Edward was stricken with Alzheimer's disease she tirelessly cared for him, never complaining, always concerned with his needs. When it was necessary to place him in a nursing home, she was there daily to make sure his every need was met.

I can't imagine the term "Mother of the Year" suiting anyone better than Edith von der Hayden. It is truly a well-deserved title for this fine English lady.



COLONY POINT CLUB, INC. BOARD OF DIRECTORS MEETING

March 21, 2012 7:00 PM MEETING HIGHLIGHTS

A quorum was achieved with 9 Board members present.

The Board of Directors approved the Minutes of the meetings held on January 18th, February 1st and February 9th, 2012.

The Board discussed the proposals for pressure cleaning and sealing the pavers on the pool deck and tabled the decision pending further information.

A Protocol for Contracts had been presented to the Board for consideration. It was reviewed by the Association's attorney for compliance with the Association Documents. There was Board discussion with a vote being called for. The vote was three members in favor of adopting the protocol with six members against. Without a majority vote, the motion failed.

At the request of several residents, the Board appointed a Committee to research new lawn maintenance vendors.

The Board is looking into the possibility of installing an electrical outlet on the exterior wall of the clubhouse near the large tiki hut.

Proposals are being obtained to have the community sidewalks and walkways repaired.

At the request of residents, the Board is looking into the feasibility of installing a barrier behind the racquetball courts to prevent the ball from rolling into the shrubbery.

The board tabled the decision of replacing the heater on the south spa pending additional proposals.

Additional work is needed on the storm drain system to complete the required 5-year recertification for South Broward Drainage.

Broward County Property Appraiser Lori Parrish Answers
Your Questions...

"Missed the Homestead Exemption Filing Deadline?"

Dear Lori,

I missed the March 1st deadline to file my 2012 Homestead Exemption. Is there anything I can do at this point to have my property tax exemption applied for 2012?

L.C., Dania Beach, FL (via email)

You still have time to file for your 2012 exemptions! The traditional filing period for Homestead Exemption for 2012 was March 2, 2011 through March 1, 2012. The absolute deadline to "Late File" for any 2012 property tax exemption - if you missed the March 1, 2012 timely filing deadline is September 18, 2012. State law (Sec 196.001 (8), Fla. Stat.) does not allow late filing for property tax exemptions after this date, regardless of any good cause reason for missing the late filing deadlines.

Our office accepts late applications for 2012 Homestead, Senior, Disability, Widow/Widower, Granny Flat, Portability, Non-Profit and all other exemptions until September 18, 2012. To qualify for a 2012 exemption, you must have been named on the deed; made the property your permanent residence, and owned no other property with any residency based exemptions as of January 1, 2012.

You may also be eligible for Portability. Portability

allows Homesteaded owners to transfer some or all of their Save Our Homes (SOH) benefit from their old home to their new home. Your Portability amount is determined by the difference between the "Just Value" and the "Assessed SOH Value" of your property in the year of Homestead abandonment. If you had a Florida Homestead Exemption in 2010 or 2011; gave up the exemption; and moved to a new homestead by January 1, 2012, you must file for Homestead and complete a Portability application with our office by September 18, 2012.

There are several ways to complete your exemption application. You can apply online at www.bcpa.net, visit our office at 115 S. Andrews Ave., Room 111, in Fort Lauderdale, or you can apply at one of our many community outreach events throughout the county. View our entire outreach calendar at www.bcpa.net/events.asp to find out when we will be in your neighborhood. To file for a 2012 or 2013 Homestead Exemption online, simply visit our website and click on the yellow box at the upper left corner of the home page. If you have any questions or need help with your tax exemption applications, please do not hesitate to contact us at 954.357.6830.

Start Recycling



As the single most popular log-in used to access online accounts, it's also the one most easily hacked by cybercriminals. Changing the o to 0, "passw0rd" is not much better.

With more and more websites now requiring passwords to include both letters and numbers you may think you are safe with "abc123". Not so. This one ranked 5th easiest to hack. Joining the longtime "don't use" password "qwerty" - the top left letters on a keyboard - is "qazwsx", a top to bottom sequence on the left. Sid says that officials are baffled by the popularity of "monkey" and "shadow". There is also increased use of common names. What is clear is that using any of these passwords significantly increases your risk of identity theft.

Here's how to make passwords harder to hack yet easier to remember: GO LONG. Use at least 12 keystrokes. One study shows that a good 12 character password would take hackers more than 17,000 years to crack. MIX IT UP. Use upper and lower case letters, spaces, underscores and symbols like @ and %. FINESSEYOUR FAVORITES. For easier recall, base your passwords on foods you like, TV shows or first words of a song, but with tweaks, symbols and conscious misspellings. Whatever you choose, use different passwords to access online financial accounts, email, social networking and even to post comments on websites. Consider changing them every 90 days or so.

To gauge password protection, go to Microsoft.com/security and select "Create Strong Passwords".

On a good note; when I returned to Colony Point after a long weekend there were messages on the answering machine from unit owners with congratulations on how good and helpful the guards are. Also, a letter was written by another unit owner and delivered to the Clubhouse stating how helpful the guard staff was in finding and returning a set of keys.

- Please do not dispose of trash on community property. The parking lot and grounds are not a trash receptacle.
- Absolutely no dogs, cats or other animals allowed on the property.
- As a reminder, please refer to the Blue Book of rules and regulations for information on delivery times, moving in and out, etc.

An interesting aside here is the astounding number of vehicles that were processed into Colony Point during the month of April 2011. How about 6348? Thanks for the great work guys.


IMPORTANT SUPPLEMENT!!!

Due to the increasing number of disturbing and annoying incidences at Colony Point it is necessary that we turn to strict implementation of the existing rules governing parking, as follows:

- 1. Unit owners **must** have a Colony Point sticker on their car. It is placed there when you get your bar code and must remain there. It does not identify your unit, only your assigned parking spot.
- Do not use a guest spot while leaving your assigned spot vacant. If there is more than 1 car associated with your unit, then of course the additional vehicle uses a guest spot.
- Unit owners or guests do not have the right to park in another unit owner's numbered spot without proper permission.
- A sticker will be put on the car window of any guest who does not display the guest pass on the dash board.
- 5. Parking in the fire lane or without a handicapped sign in the handicapped spaces will result in the following actions being taken:
 - A. Warning sign will be placed on the window of the car.
 - B. Your bar code will be subject to deactivation.
 - C. You will be subject to a \$100 fine.
 - D. The car may be towed, at your expense.
