The recently closed coffee manufacturing plant at 5725 Highway 7 started producing coffee in 1977, when McGarvey Coffee—owned by Superior Coffee and Foods—moved to town. McGarvey Coffee did quite well in St. Louis Park, providing products that were used in 70 percent of restaurants in the Upper Midwest. Current owner Sara Lee bought the plant in 1991.

Board member Paula Evensen echoed Larson's thoughts. "I started on the Elmwood Board several years ago," she said. "Our current president moved to another home in St. Louis Park, and our neighborhood association was inactive for a while. With the help of Tom Larson and some other former board members, we got Elmwood active once again."

She continued, "I am proud of how we worked with the city and developers during the building of the Wooddale condos, the Towerlight project, the fire stations and the never-ending light rail station discussions. I am looking forward to seeing a new group of neighbors leading us forward."

- . Traffic signals


Representatives from the City of St. Louis Park as well as councilmember Anne Mavity will be on hand, as well.

### Neighborhood Company Bemis to Close Doors

Bemis Co. will reportedly close two Twin Cities plants this year, resulting in layoffs for more than 160 employees.

The Neenah, Wis.-based packaging company will close a St. Louis Park plant by late September and a Minneapolis plant by the end of the year, Minnesota Public Radio reported. The move will result in the loss of 162 jobs.

Bemis told MPR that the closings — as well as a handful of others domestically and internationally — are aimed at increasing the company's efficiency. About 500 employees will lose their jobs companywide. (reprinted from *TwinCities.com*)
