



Walton's Garden Center – Gardening Tips

- -Plant during or directly after rain for best survival rate for Fall plantings
- -Never pack or tamp down the soil when planting anything and do not walk on the soil in your planting beds.-Shredded leaves make nutritious organic mulch. Our soils here are heavy clay with a high pH. The cure to poor soil is to amend with at least 40% organic matter. The best organic material is shredded leaves and rotted compost. Peat moss is not a good amendment material. Do a soil test to determine what nutrients your soil needs. Contact your County Extension Service to get details on a soil test.
- -Plant bulbs that bloom in Spring such a daffodils, crocus, and hyacinths. These are some of the bulbs that will naturalize in your garden and require very little care.
- -For cheerful Winter color, plant pansies violas and ornamental cabbage.

He is remembered for his great friendship to us all, his love for his family, his fantastic sense of humor, his laugh, his wonderful smile, his chickens, birds, rabbits and fish, his wonderful home and gardens, his love of his neighborhood, his street and striving to keep things local and, of course, his parties!

When he contemplated moving away from the neighborhood at one point, his neighbors would have none of that! They would continue to remind him of how important he was to us all, the many relationships he had, his wonderful yard and all the great celebrations. They did this while passing him another beer to help convince him that this is where he belonged. He was the center of many groups and a part of many others. He was involved in the neighborhood Garden Tour, the East Dallas Chicken Coop Tour, he was the Boy Babe in the Barbaree Babes



Artist enclave and he helped to organize the LFH GLT group and he and many other families represented in the first 4th of July Parade. He was key in organizing many of the block parties, garage sales, his own backyard art shows and gatherings on his street and became the glue to connect and keep so many of us together...he was our common denominator. He was a good friend whether it was keeping an eye on us as he drove by or rode by smiling on his cruising bike with the basket on the front, being there to help when a beloved pet died or plant sharing or designing a friend's garden. When one of his neighbors was moving away, she said it was important for her to bring "people" with her, so she dug up the plant Vince gave her and it continues to grow with her at her new house. He was also remembered for taking care of a friend's yard while he was away and when he returned, Vince had moved the plants around with a "re-design" of the yard. He loved to invite people into



his beautiful yard and hosted many impromptu gatherings with a cocktail in hand. We all loved his backyard and it served as a community meeting place, an oasis and miniature farm in the hood. One of his chickens was even in a local movie.

He has been described as the Mayor of Little Forest Hills and the

Queen of Redondo Drive! He loved gardening, art and people and we loved him for all of that. Vince had a magical way of being a part of so many people's lives and even though that part may have been small, it was magnified in size by the vast number of people who he touched and, as a result, his life and presence became so much more than just "our friend from down the street." Vince was the friend we all wanted to have, not just because we wanted to be a part of his interesting and eclectic life, but because his collection of friends included members from all walks, ways, stripes, kinds, ideas and ideals and to have

a membership in that collective was to have a membership in the greatest show on earth - right on our own block. One of his good friends and neighbor Jean-Marie Roman shared this poem that he wrote the day that Vince passed:

It rains over Redondo Drive. It's raining tears from all your neighbors. This special rain will germinate the seeds that you planted in our hearts. You will bloom within us forever!



The new site is designed to provide all the information rescue groups need to run the most effective and humane rescue organization possible. Talk about impeccable timing.

Animalsheltering.org website has long been a reliable source for animal shelter staff looking for information on best practices in a variety of areas, and now rescue groups will be able to benefit from HSUS' expertise as well. From the latest money saving tips to expert advice on recruiting and retaining foster homes, the new Rescue Central section of animalsheltering.org has it all.

To help you navigate this new section, it is divided it into four segments: Business of Saving Lives, Rescuing Done Right, Show Me the Money, and Building Solid Relationships.

To run a successful rescue, you need more than just animal smarts—you need business savvy. Starting off right will help set your organization up for long-term success. In the Business of Saving Lives area you can learn the technicalities of starting and running a rescue: Starting a rescue (includes the legal issues involved), building an effective board, and managing your resources.

Every rescue feels the pressure to do more, but sometimes that can result in providing less than ideal care for the animals you already have. In Rescuing Done Right, you'll find tools to help ensure your animals are getting the very best care, every single day: Best practices (The Five Freedoms, the ASV Guidelines, hoarding resources and state and local ordinances, as well as volunteer program materials, foster program guidelines and ideas to maximize adoptions.

The love you put into your rescue is free, but everything else costs money! 
Adoptable Pets of Little Forest Hills



Longing for an English-style garden, I dismissed the idea of Xeriscaping as not conducive to that vision. But touring our neighborhood and visiting with fellow gardeners, it is so heartening to know that beautiful, colorful gardens can be achieved by incorporating all or some of the principals of Xeriscaping as demonstrated in the garden at 8815 Redondo.

Xeriscape landscapes need not be cactus and rock gardens. They can be green, cool landscapes full of beautiful plants maintained with water-efficient practices. The same green Texas-style landscape which we are accustomed to can be achieved and still conserve water.


In urban areas of Texas about 25 percent of the water supply is used for landscape and garden watering. Much of this water is used to maintain traditionally high water-demanding landscapes or it is simply applied inefficiently.

Xeriscape landscaping incorporates seven basic principles which lead to saving water:

- Planning and design
- Soil analysis
- Practical turf areas
- Appropriate plant selection
- Efficient irrigation
- Use of mulches
- Appropriate maintenance
