Thank You For...

Storing Trash Cans Properly out of Sight We Are Good Neighbors

As we continue to address violations within the development, the issue of trash cans being visible from the street has attracted some debate. While some neighbors don't see it as an issue worth pursuing, many others do. So, what choices as a governing Board do we have? The covenants spell out quite clearly that trash cans should be stored inside a building such as a garage or shed. The board has relaxed this stipulation to allow storage of trash cans behind a wooden fence. It was roughly 4 years ago when the Neighborhood Improvement Committee (NIC) was formed and given the task of addressing this very issue. Some of you might remember the door hangers that were left at your house, explaining the unsightliness of the neighborhood due to so many trash cans being visible. How Realtors had made phone calls and left comments on the CWCA voice mail line expressing their reluctance in bringing potential clients into the neighborhood for viewings. After the initial presentation of the door hanger and friendly letters notifying residents of the



covenant, we saw a dramatic difference in how trash cans were being stored. Now, 4 years later, it has become clear that a reminder is necessary. We are aware that the huge new receptacles from trash companies may be hard to store in the garage. Take some time to check out how your trash cans are stored, and if need be, create a special enclosure for them. Keep in mind that the enclosure cannot be taller than 42", and it must be behind the front setback of the house per Jeffco Zoning regulations. With the high winds that we experience through-

out the year, (ie. October 16th& 17th) trash and recycling have a larger tendency to escape and travel around the streets, spreading trash into others yards. Since

coyotes, foxes, elk, raccoons,

and other critters are regularly seen in the neighborhood, we know any food smells could lure them closer, creating an unsafe situation for children, pets, and any residents walking in the area. The Board has taken legal recourse on some homeowners for NOT properly storing trash cans out of site. It isn't fun to do, nor do they want to do this. Our volunteers would much rather spend time and membership money on planning community events for the whole development to enjoy. If you have questions about the covenants, please review them, they are posted on the website. Help us to help everyone within Columbine West to see each other as "good neighbors".



One Minute Wellness... The Stress Factor

Stress is a major factor impacting health and wellness. When the body reacts with alarm to either real or perceived threats there are hormonal, physiological and biochemical changes taking place instantly. The muscles become tense as the release of adrenaline and other hormones initiates an alarm reaction. Physiological changes occur in response to the stress stimulus. The body needs more glucose for the muscles to function properly, so the liver responds by releasing insulin into the bloodstream. For the glucose to be transformed into energy, extra oxygen is required. The heart begins pumping blood faster to carry this extra supply, leading to a rise in blood pressure. However, the amount of blood available in the body is limited. Therefore, in order to deliver extra blood to select areas, there is a temporary cutoff in blood supply to non-priority areas. Consequently, the digestive system slows or stops altogether, the salivary glands stop secreting, blood vessels in the kidneys and the abdomen constrict and the immune system slows down. Additionally, new studies are showing that stress can shrink your brain cells and prematurely age your immune system. However, THERE IS HOPE! Healthy nutrition and consistent exercise can make a huge difference. This is a time of year when many folks would rather "hibernate" to stay out of the cold, so there are many very simple ways (in the comfort of your own home) to get a lot of movement. 
