Dear Friends,

It's been a busy few months and it will only get busier as we head into the holiday season. It was great to see so many WANA members at the Grand Opening of the first phase of Willow Springs Park, the 4-acre Longview Point. We enjoyed a jazz concert and sunset from the highest point in Long Beach. If you missed it, make a point to visit our beautiful new park at 2745 Orange Avenue. The master plan for the full 47-acre park should be coming to the Parks Commission for approval soon as we continue to pursue this opportunity.



As you know from my article last month, the City was recently awarded a grant to plant 6000 new trees in parts of the city that are affected most by pollution from goods movement, including Wrigley. After the holiday season, I will be calling on WANA to help me organize tree plantings in the Wrigley neighborhood. These trees are chosen for their air quality benefits and for their ability to fit in our parkways without damaging sidewalks (unlike some that are there now). Several other neighborhood groups in the 7<sup>th</sup> District have begun planning their tree plantings and I hope WANA will too. If you don't have a tree in the parkway in front of your home and would like one, please contact my office at (562) 570-7777 in order to sign up.

The City Council also recently approved the 2013 Capital Improvement Plan (CIP). In the 2013 CIP, we designated Spring Street for repair. We funded and began the design work for Spring in the 2012 budget and Spring will be the next arterial street in the area repaired, though the work will take some time. With the heavy traffic due to the school and the Blue Line, this street is in desperate need of work and we're going to get it done.

In addition to Spring Street, the City also has received a grant to make significant improvements to Willow Street between Atlantic Avenue and the Los Angeles River. Public Works and I will be presenting to WANA at your upcoming meeting to get community input on this project; the goal is to make Willow more beautiful and pedestrian friendly. Possible improvements include improving the sidewalks, installing designer light poles, improving the medians with new plantings, improved crosswalks and signals, and more. I look forward to getting your input on how we can make this the best project possible.

It's hard to believe, but it's almost time again for the Daisy Avenue Parade. This year's parade is Saturday, December 8<sup>th</sup> at 5 PM. Other events include the Tree Lighting and Decoration Contest (Dec. 7<sup>th</sup>, 7 PM), the Entertainment Nights with live music and dancing (Dec 9<sup>th</sup>, 14<sup>th</sup>-16<sup>th</sup>, 7 PM), and Snow Day (Dec 22<sup>nd</sup>, 11 AM). Keep an eye out for parking restrictions and traffic postings as we approach the parade. I look forward to seeing you on Daisy Lane.


