LETTER FROM THE PRESIDENT

North Glen Square, with the help of our sister neighborhoods, claimed a victory last month. The City of Phoenix zoning hearing officer denied a request for a variance and a use permit for a pawn shop at 3411 W Northern Ave. The zoning variance was required to operate the pawn shop within 500 feet of a residential district. There are several requirements that must be met for a variance to be granted. Among others, 1) there must be something unusual about the property that causes a hardship for the owner in trying to utilize the property; and 2) the property cannot be reasonably used without the variance. We argued that neither of these conditions applied. The zoning hearing officer determined that none of the four requirements were met and denied the variance accordingly.

This win demonstrates how important it is to have a neighborhood group like ours that can stay on top of issues that affect every resident of North Glen Square. It also shows how important it is to have a close working relationship with our sister neighborhoods so we can come together to work on issues like this.

We are currently working with another neighborhood association on a liquor license issue where we believe the owners do not have the capability to reliably manage a liquor license in a manner that will protect the public and nearby residential neighborhood. With our combined experience and resources, we are able to do substantial research and assemble very compelling arguments for city staff and the city council. When appropriate, we meet with applicants to better understand their qualifications and intentions. We work closely with Phoenix Police and the city **prosecutor's office when we decide a liquor license may have a negative affect on neighborhoods.**

While these recent examples represent situations where we are opposed, we also work hard to be fair and objective. There are many cases where we choose not to oppose, or withdraw our opposition to a liquor license or zoning case after meeting with the applicant, discussing concerns, and coming to agreement. The goal is to help guide North Glen Square according to our vision for a healthy, stable neighborhood. Unfortunately, some of our sister associations have already witnessed the effects of losing the battle where crime, blight and apathy take over. With your help, we can avoid this bleak future and continue to make North Glen Square a desired location to call home.

HISTORY OF PHOENIX NEIGHBORHOOD PATROL

The Phoenix Neighborhood Patrol Program began in 1994 as Block Watchers on Patrol and was associated with the Block Watch McGruff logo. In 1995 P.N.P. members donated over 5,468 hours of their time patrolling their neighborhoods. By 2004, they spent over 26,000 hours and traveled 77,490 miles assisting the police officers of the City of Phoenix Police Department by driving through their neighborhoods and watching for suspicious criminal behavior, fights, traffic problems, stolen vehicles, and missing persons.

In 1999 the program adopted the name of Phoenix Neighborhood Patrol and its new logo. We have had the opportunity and privilege of training over 1500 citizens in observation skills, criminal codes, police procedures, and drug recognition through non- confrontational methods.

In 2009 members logged over 53,000 miles and volunteered over 25,000 hours of their time to their neighborhood! That is over \$527,000 in value to the community. Page 3



IT'S HIP TO SNIP

Free Spay Days at The Arizona Humane Society! Upcoming Spay Days are December 20, 2012 and January 17, 2013.

Pets will be accepted on a first come first serve basis. They will Spay/Neuter 50 total animals each free surgery day - 10 large dogs, 15 small dogs and 25 cats. Check-in starts at 6 a.m.

Pre-Surgery instructions:

- Don't give your pets any food for 12 hours prior to the surgery
- All Pets must be between 2 months and 6 years of age.
- All pets must weigh between 3 -100 pounds.
- Dogs. Must be on a leash and cats must be in a carrier.
- Blood work is required for all pets over 5 years old at the owner's expense.
- Some fees may apply

The third Thursday of every month, they will also be providing free spay and neuter surgeries at our Arizona Humane Society Sunnyslope location: 1311 W. Hatcher Rd. Phoenix, AZ 85021.

Unfortunately, because we are a low-risk public clinic, they may not be able to accept overtly aggressive animals or animals with illness or injury, to ensure the safety of your pet and our staff. CITY OF PHOENIX YARD SALE GUIDE – FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

How many garage/yard sales can I have per year?

The Zoning Ordinance limits the number of garage/ yard sales at any residential property (house, condo, apartment development, etc.) to TWO sales within a twelve month period. Each garage/yard sale may not exceed three consecutive days.

Can I have a yard sale on the sidewalk or in the street?

No, yard sales should only be conducted on residentially zone properties.

Can we have a community yard sale at our apt/condo development?

Yes, if it is conducted in an approved common area and you have the permission of the property owner or HOA. The landscaped area surrounding a development is not an approved common area. Anyone interested in having a yard sale at a multi-family development should coordinate with the property owner and/or HOA since only TWO sales every twelve months are allowed per property.

What items can I sell?

The purpose of a yard sale is to allow residents to dispose of household items, clothing, furniture, etc. Residents may not use yard sales to sell vehicles, new or commercial items not intended for household use.

Can I have a yard sale on a vacant lot?

No, this is not permitted.

Who do I call if my neighbors are having frequent garage/yard sales?
