Shoveling Your Sidewalks Clear Are Good Neighbors

The weather newscasters have told us that November is the snowiest month and it seems that we may be in store for our weather pattern to be changing again. When those amazingly beautiful flakes begin to pile up, causing us to run inside through the garage to get warm and not want to be bothered being outside, remember those who do walk the neighborhood and benefit from cleared off sidewalks. Those homeowners who have a north facing front yard/driveway, which inevitably has its problems with snow melting off during the day, please pay attention to removing the snow before temperatures drop in the evening. Whether you have access to a motorized snow removal system or will be using the tried and true old fashion shovel, take a look at these shoveling safety tips. If you find your walkway covered in white stuff after a snowstorm, follow these safe shoveling tips from North Dakota State University: *Avoid shoveling if you have high blood pressure or cholesterol, *Drink plenty of water to avoid cold-weather dehydration, *Use a shovel with a smaller blade to avoid back strain from lifting big loads of snow, *Use correct form: Stand with feet hip-width apart, bend at the knees and tighten your abdominal muscles as you lift the shovel. -SamsClub.com/healthyliving



Columbine Kiwanis Bell Ringing

What does a bell ringer do? They do not ask people for money. They are not to be aggressive or impede traffic. They just ring the bell and say thank you if someone gives to the kettle. Most often you will receive a warm smile, thank you and a genuine Merry Christmas salutation. The Kiwanis will be ringing their bells at King Soopers on Coalmine/Pierce and Chatfield/Wadsworth, December 14th-24th. They will also be seen at the Ken Caryl/Simms King Soopers, December 22nd, 23rd and 24th. Last year these dedicated volunteers collected \$16,000 in donations to the Salvation Army. The group is always willing to train more volunteers to help with the ringing, call Ken Sweet 303-973-8253.

The red kettle has a long standing tradition during the holiday season. In 1891, Salvation Army Captain Joseph McFee was distraught because so many poor individuals in San Francisco were going hungry. During the holiday season, he resolved to provide a free Christmas dinner for the destitute and poverty-stricken. He only had one major hurdle to overcome - funding the project. Where would the money come from, he wondered. He lay awake nights, worrying, thinking, praying about how he could find the funds to fulfill his commitment of feeding 1,000 of the city's poorest individuals on Christmas Day. As he pondered the issue, his thoughts drifted back to his sailor days in Liverpool, England. He remembered how at Stage Landing, where the boats came in, there was a large, iron kettle called "Simpson's Pot" into which passers-by tossed a coin or two to help the poor. The next day Captain McFee placed a similar pot at the Oakland Ferry Landing at the foot of Market Street. Beside the pot, he placed a sign that read, "Keep the Pot Boiling." He soon had the money to see that the needy people were properly fed at Christmas. Six years later, the kettle idea spread from the west coast to the Boston area. That year, the combined effort nationwide resulted in 150,000 Christmas dinners for the needy. In 1901, kettle contributions in New York City provided funds for the first mammoth sit-down dinner in Madison Square Garden, a custom that continued for many years. Today in the U.S., The Salvation Army assists more than four-and-a-half million people during the Thanksgiving and Christmas time periods. Captain McFee's kettle idea launched a tradition that has spread not only throughout the United States, but all across the world. Kettles are now used in such distant lands as Korea, Japan, Chile and many European countries. Everywhere, public contributions to Salvation Army kettles enable the organization to continue its year-round efforts at helping those who would otherwise be forgotten. Stop at one of the kettles sponsored by the Columbine Kiwanis, located at local King Soopers. Bring the holidays alive for those less fortunate and feel good about helping a neighbor.

Columbine Kiwanis is group of volunteers dedicated primarily to children in our local community. We also have fun at our meetings which include an interesting speaker and social events. 

One Minute Wellness... Home Exercises

Many people conjure up particular images when the word "exercise" comes up in conversation. We think of things like boot camps, gyms, weight lifting, outdoor sports or any variety of activities, based on our own experiences. I prefer to use the words "movement" or "strength builders" when speaking of activities that help us get stronger, have more energy, feel less stress and enjoy better health. I once heard "Movement is Life" and as a nurse of many years I saw that played out first hand. Inactivity due to illness, injury, life circumstances, jobs and any number of factors leads to undesirable effects on the body. Simply put, "the body was designed for movement". Workouts should be designed for your individual body and life-style. Articles don't apply to everyone equally. That being said, I would like to offer a few options that can be done at home and if practiced consistently, can make a difference.

- 1. Sit on the edge of a firm chair with feet apart. Stand up and sit down without stopping for as many times as you can. Rest and then try again. If this bothers your knees widen them apart with toes out.
- 2. Lie on your back on a floor with your knees bent and feet wide and close to your butt. Lay your hands on the floor with your hands palms down. Lift and lower your butt as many times as you can, then move your knees together and reach towards your knees. Stay up there and pulse your straight arms across the top your knees as many times as you can.
- **3. Stand with arms straight.** Make small arm rotations in complete circles for as long as you can. First with arms in front then out to your sides.
- **4. Try push ups.** They can be modified by angling your body and pushing off a counter. Lifting your fingers off the surface will help you push into your palms more.
- **5.** Lay down on your back and stand up, lay back down and stand up. Repeat as many as you can.
