Millions of Ohioans will honor their right to vote on Tuesday, November 6th, expressing who their choice is to lead this country, this state, even their local governments. Many, due to Ohio's early voting laws have already begun to vote, either by mail-in ballot or in person at a special polling place.

Columbus and Franklin County residents may vote early at 1700 Morse Road on the city's northeast side, in a former Kohl's store. COTA provides service to this polling location for inperson absentee voting.

Note: The outcome of pending litigation relating to early voting on the three days prior to Election Day (as in 2008) is uncertain at this time. Further information is available at through the Ohio Secretary of State www.sos.state.oh.us

Please remember to bring acceptable identification with you for early voting or to the polls on November 6th. To find and confirm your polling place and to ask any other voting questions, contact the Franklin County Board of Elections at 614.525.3111 or online Vote.FranklinCountyOhio.gov
