# HISTORY OF PHOENIX NEIGHBORHOOD PATROL

The Phoenix Neighborhood Patrol Program began in 1994 as Block Watchers on Patrol and was associated with the Block Watch McGruff logo. In 1995 P.N.P. members donated over 5,468 hours of their time patrolling their neighborhoods. By 2004, they spent over 26,000 hours and traveled 77,490 miles assisting the police officers of the City of Phoenix Police Department by driving through their neighborhoods and watching for suspicious criminal behavior, fights, traffic problems, stolen vehicles, and missing persons.

In 1999 the program adopted the name of Phoenix Neighborhood Patrol and its new logo. We have had the opportunity and privilege of training over 1500 citizens in observation skills, criminal codes, police procedures, and drug recognition through non-confrontational methods.

In 2009 members logged over 53,000 miles and volunteered over 25,000 hours of their time to their neighborhood! That is over \$527,000 in value to the community.

# IMPORTANT NOTICE - PROPOSED CHANGE TO THE ASSOCIATION BYLAWS

Because of the difficulty in finding new volunteers to serve on the Board, it has become necessary for current Officers and Directors to rotate roles every two years in order to comply with our bylaws. A change to the bylaws has been proposed which will allow our elected officers and directors to stay in their respective positions for as long as needed until another volunteer steps forward. This is certainly not the preferred method of resolution to this problem, but it addressed the issue of possible violation of the bylaws.

The section of the bylaws as currently written, as well as the proposed changes (with strike-through) are as follows:

# ARTICLE IV EXECUTIVE BOARD

# Section 3. Term of Office.

- a. <u>Term of Office</u>. The Board members shall be elected at the Annual Meeting of the Association and shall serve a term of one (1) year. Individuals may be elected to succeed themselves, provided that no person shall serve in the same position for more than two (2) consecutive years. A Board member who has served two (2) consecutive one-year terms shall be eligible for re-election to the same position after an interval of one (1) year.
- b. <u>Interim Term</u>. A person elected or appointed as an officer to fill an unexpired term of less than one (1) year shall be eligible for re-election to two (2) fully consecutive terms.

This item will be put to vote by the membership in attendance at the February 14th meeting of the association.



# WATCH OUT FOR POLLUTION

October 1st was the start of the winter air pollution season. Stagnant air, temperature inversions and fire-place use can contribute to high levels of particulates, which are small particles from dust, vehicle emissions and burning wood. When particulate levels get too high, Maricopa County will issue a Health Watch (approaching the health standard) or a High Pollution advisory (exceeding the health standard). You can check the forecast, sign up for email or text alerts and download smart phone apps at www.cleanairmakemore.com.

Once you're aware of the forecast, do your part to avoid adding to the pollution in our air. By taking small, simple steps every day, we can all make a difference.

- Do not use woodburning fireplaces, woodstoves or outdoor firepits on a No Burn Day
- Use a rake or broom instead of using a leaf blower
- Drive slowly or not at all on unpaved roads and vacant lots


