Visitation: 6 to 8 p.m. Thursday at Mount Olivet Funeral Home. Dorothy was born Aug. 14, 1918, in Tulsa, Okla., to Roy and Ruth Arnold. She graduated from Central High School in Tulsa, Okla., in 1936, and from Oklahoma A&M in 1940 with a degree in elementary education. She taught second grade in Skatook, Okla., from 1940 to 1943, then she began teaching first grade at Franklin Elementary in Tulsa, Okla. In 1950 she moved to Tucson, Ariz., and taught first grade for three years. In 1953 she married Ernest Glazner and moved to Fort Worth, where she taught at Bonnie Brae Elementary and later Springdale Elementary until she retired in 1983. In the late 1970s she was assigned to teach a complete first-grade class of Vietnamese students who spoke no English, then at the end of the year they could all speak and read English. She was a member of Meadowbrook United Methodist Church. Dorothy served with Citizens on Patrol and numerous civic organizations. Her unlimited curiosity and cheery outlook will be missed by all who knew her.

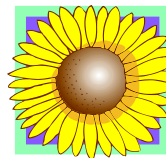

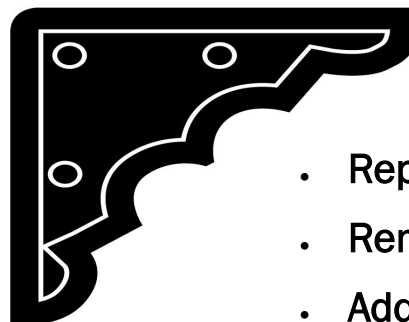
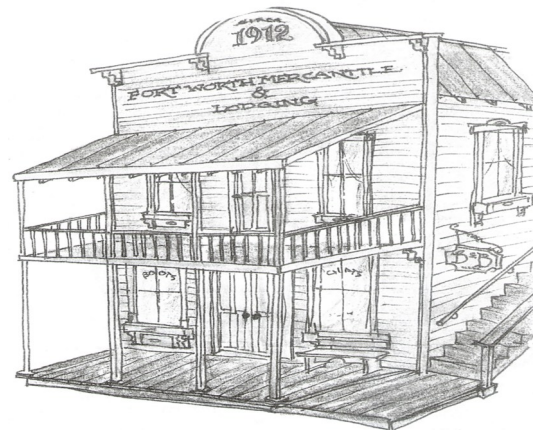
