



HERE ARE SOME WEB SITES:

To look up **Activity Logs (Calls for Service)** about the neighborhood, you have several choices.

They will not give you the exact house number, just the block number of the house.

Go to www.fwpd.org

Choose activity log – then click on any available date.

In the upper right corner a tab for 'community search'.

This tab will provide you the ability to put in your neighborhood calls for service. (Bloomingdale is listed)

Go to http://spotcrime.com/

At the home page put in your street address, city, state and zip At the map – click on the icon and there is more information. Click on information and a photo of the closest corner appears.

Then scroll down to see a list near your address.

Also to get to the same photo you can click on the first column which brings up the Same photo and information.

If you would like to **receive emails** with the call of service close to your address Go to the home page and under the location is an email alert.

*** I strongly recommend that you only pick a location of about 1 mile.

Another way to look up calls of service is by going to News Sentinel Web Site Go under the LIGHTS AND SIRENS tab.
