

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El Dorado Exemplary Homes Campaign 2013

In 2007, the El Dorado Homes Association held the first ever Exemplary Homes Campaign as a way to recognize and thank those residents, both owners and renters, who help make El Dorado a nice place to live through payment of their annual association maintenance fees and by keeping a well maintained home and property.

The guidelines for participation in the event are pretty simple: just pay your annual association maintenance fees and keep up your property's curb appeal by having nice landscaping and high maintenance standards.

The campaign is divided into two phases, where 30 exemplary homes are chosen in May and 30 more are chosen in August. Since many residents don't pay their annual maintenance fees until summer, when the pool opens, May's winners are limited to those residents who paid their maintenance fees in 2012 and August's winners are limited to those who pay their fees for 2013.

To determine which homes are awarded Exemplary Home status, the six neighborhood association area reps will nominate 8 to 10 homes in each of their respective areas. Then an independent panel of judges, who do not live in El Dorado and who do not know last year's winners, will score the nominees. The scores will then be averaged and the 5 homes with the highest scores in each area will be given the title of Exemplary Home.

The winners receive a temporary yard sign announcing their status as an Exemplary Home and also an invitation to the Exemplary Homes Party in September at the neighborhood clubhouse. At the party, food and beverages will be served and all winners will have a shot at winning fabulous door prizes generously donated by the event's sponsors. Since 2007, we've given away nearly \$11,000.00 in door prizes.

Judging will take place the first week in May and again the first week in August. All residents are encouraged to clean up and increase the curb appeal of their property. Judges will be looking at the overall appearance of the homes and property. In many cases, it's the minor details which determine the winners. Homes with deed, covenant, or code violations are automatically ineligible from participating.

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Think **EDHA** could do more?

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NEWS FROM DISTRICT 10

Changes to City's Drought Ordinance

Changes to the city's drought ordinance are now in effect for SAWS customers after San Antonio City Council approved revisions on February 7.

"We listened to feedback from the community about the drought regulations and worked with stakeholders to propose changes to the drought ordinance that will allow us to save water while minimizing some of the inconveniences," said Karen Guz, SAWS Director of Conservation." "By adjusting the hours for watering and allowing residential fountains and home car washing, we can still achieve the water cutbacks that we need."

During the morning and evening watering windows, people with irrigation systems can now easily see broken sprinkler heads and leaks, which waste water and increase bills. The changes to the ordinance are a winwin for all involved.

Drought ordinance changes are now in effect and include the following:

- Watering hours are now **7 to 11 a.m. and 7 to 11 p.m.** on your watering day during drought Stages 2 through 4. The hours for Year-Round and Stage 1 remain the same.
- Drought stages will be triggered based on a 10-day rolling average. Coming out of drought stages can be considered 15 days after the aguifer is above the trigger.
- Home car washing is available during drought stages on Saturday or Sunday as long as there is no water waste or run off.
- Residential fountains can operate at any stage of drought.
- Small commercial fountains (under 1,000 sq. ft.) are permitted with a basic variance in all drought stages.
- Large commercial fountains (over 1,000 sq. ft.) can operate during limited hours after demonstrating efficiencies through a conservation plan and inspection.
- Hand watering is still allowed any day and time during all drought stages.

Those with irrigation systems will need to adjust controllers for the new watering times in drought Stages 2 through 4. More information on changes to San Antonio's drought ordinance are available at

SPRING IS IN THE AIR

Spring is the busiest time for the avid gardener so let's get to it! There are lots of projects that need to be done to prepare your landscape for the coming growing season from your lawn to shrubs and trees to your vegetable garden and flower gardens. The weather is a major factor to consider. The national weather service is calling for a dry spring and summer and San Antonio Water system is already discussing stage three water restrictions by May, so keep this in mind when planning.

To help your lawn survive drought conditions there are several things that you can do. One is to aerate, aeration is the mechanical cultivation of the soil. Core type aerators are available at several equipment rental companies close to us. To reduce the cost of the rental, you could team up with your neighbors to aerate several lawns at the same time. Aeration is physically demanding so you could also hire a lawn care company to perform this project.

In conjunction with aeration, top dressing with a quality top dressing mix will improve water retention, this is <u>not</u> top soil. Top soil usually contains clay, our soils already contain more than enough clay. A top dressing mix consist of washed sand and compost, several local landscape supply companies carry quality top dressing mixes.

It is almost time to fertilize but not yet. Fertilization should take place after your lawn has broken dormancy. Use a fertilizer with a 3-

1-2 ratio such a 19-5-9, 9-3-6, or 15-5-10. It should also be a 50% slow release fertilizer; this ensures that nutrients are available for several months after application.

Mowing height is also important. Most of our lawns are St. Augustine turf. The optimal height for St. Augustine is 3 inches. Your first mowing can be lower but as spring advances and temperatures rise you will want to raise the cutting height to 3 inches. You can mow higher than 3 inches but, this will reduce the density of the leaf canopy increasing the chance for weeds to become established. Bermuda turf is more problematic due to the wide variety of cultivars available. Rule of thumb, mowing at a height above 2 1/5 inches is not recommended for any Bermuda turf. You can usually mow much lower depending on the frequency.

I am going to combine trees, shrubs, and vegetable gardens. For small scale trees, shrub beds and vegetable gardens, mulch between 2 to 3 inches deep will reduce evaporation, moderate soil temperatures, and reduce weed infestations.

Major pruning for spring flowering plants such as Indian Hawthorne, Mt. Laurel, Italian Jessamine, and any others you may have is done after flowering is complete.

And finally, water deeply to promote deeper roots. Frequent light water promotes shallow roots reducing the ability of plants to withstand drought conditions.

Property Owner Sidewalk Maintenance Responsibility

Many Citizens assume that the City has obligation to maintain the community sidewalks to keep them free from hazard and obstruction! However, City Ordinances require sidewalks to be maintained by property owners as an extension of their front yards.

This includes:

- Minimum sidewalk clear-width of 36" free "from any defects or hazards" or obstructions such as mailboxes, basketball hoops, parked cars, trash cans, shrubbery or fences. (Code of Ordinances, City of San Antonio, Chapter 29, Article 1, Sec. 29-11)
- Minimum clear-height of 80", "keep all trees and shrubs on the premises well trimmed so they will not overhang the sidewalks or streets in such a manner as to interfere with free passage." (Code Ordinances, City of San Antonio, Chapter 29, Article 1, Sec. 29-10)
- Maintain a smooth sidewalk rolling surface free "from any defects or hazards" such as large cracks, broken or uplifted sidewalk segments. (Code of Ordinances, City of San Antonio, Chapter 29, Article 1, Sec. 29-11)
- ♦ Citation and Fine of up to \$500.00 (Ordinance #96242)
