Supporting the 2013 Membership Dues Drive We Are Good Neighbors

Since membership dues increased a few years ago, the association has had the opportunity to bring a few more community events to fruition. In the advertising world this concept is referred to as "value added". What is value added? Value added describes what happens when you take a basic product, e.g. membership, and increase the value of that product (and usually also the price) by adding extras in the process and/or services. So you could pick a raw coffee bean and add value by roasting it and again add value by grinding it, or simply packaging it ready to grind. You could coat some of the roasted beans in chocolate and sell them as confectionery. So, how did CWCA add value to becoming a dues paying member? The most noticeable examples are the re-development of the corner of Zephyr/Ken Caryl Ave. and the Annual Dumpster/Recycle Day (Big Event). The corner landscaping project is finished, but still requires annual maintenance, such as weed control and periodic watering throughout the hot/dry summer days. The dumpster/recycle event has given homeowners the opportunity to rid their homes of old documents to be shredded, unwanted metal items, unrepairable electronics and many trash related items no longer needed. Along with the large projects, the calendar reflects the Community Garage Sale, National Night Out, Halloween Decorating Contest and Holiday Lighting Contest. All of these events are funded by the membership fees that are collected from Columbine West residents during the Annual Dues Drive in April. In the past we have even had some new ideas shared on the dues postcard that have helped the Board make decisions on how dues could be allocated during budget reviews. 

Columbine Kiwanis: TLC Meals on Wheels

TLC Meals on Wheels is a private, non-profit organization supported by donations. They enrich the lives of seniors and others by providing nutritious meals and services that promote dignity, well-being, and independence. Monday through Friday, volunteers deliver a hot lunch to neighbors in need. Their service supports those whose age or disability makes it difficult to provide their own balanced nutrition. It also helps them stay in the security and comfort of their own home. In short, they address both hunger for food and hunger for personal contact. Each day, Monday through Friday, their cooks prepare a fresh, hot lunch in their kitchen, and volunteer drivers take these to their clients. Generally their clients are older than 60 (the average age is 82), but they serve persons under that age if disabilities create a need for their service.

No one is restricted from their service due to financial status. They charge \$4 per meal. All food is prepared without salt and diabetic needs are accommodated. TLC Meals on Wheels delivers to homes in Centennial, Littleton, Englewood, Sheridan, western Centennial, west Arapahoe County, and south Jefferson County. With the support of the Meals on Wheels program, older adults often remain independent in their homes for many years. Other clients have only short-term needs for meal delivery. They serve everyone who truly needs meals. Columbine Kiwanis Club volunteers deliver these meals in our area every Monday, every other Tuesday and every other Friday. That is over 100 trips per year delivering over 1000 meals. Our volunteer drivers spend between 2 and 3 hours per trip by the time we pick up the meals, deliver them, and get back home. With a driver and assistant on every trip that means we are spending between 450 and 700 hours per year with this project.

Columbine Kiwanis is a group of volunteers dedicated primarily to children in our local community. We also have fun at our meetings which include an interesting speaker and social events. Come check us out. Weekly scheduled meetings Wed at 6:45am at Roberts Italian Restaurant, 6745 Ken Caryl Ave. Free breakfast for first time visitors. Membership Dues are \$33.00 per month including meeting breakfasts. Guest and Interclub Breakfasts are \$6.50 each, payable to the Treasurer.

Coffee: More Uses Than You Might Imagine

Before you toss those used coffee grounds in the trash, consider this: A report in the Journal of Agricultural and Food Chemistry says that coffee grounds are rich in antioxidants and other healthy substances. Scientists speculate that coffee grounds (about 20 million pounds of which are produced every year) could be "harvested" for antioxidants, and still used for farm fertilizers and other uses instead of being dumped in landfills. Note: Filter, plunger, and espresso-type coffeemakers seem to leave the most antioxidants in their grounds, while mocha coffeemakers leave the smallest amount.

One Minute Wellness... 10 Most Common Weight Loss Mistakes

- 1. Using a scale as the only measure. Think about it, the only thing the scale measures is weight or, in other words, gravity's effect on your body. This number is measuring everything in your body such as your organs, muscles, fat, your body fluids and the waste that is sitting in your body. So, if it is fat you are trying to lose, and tone you are trying to gain, the scale only tells a small part of the story.
- 2. Starving. Starving is interesting because it comes in many disguises. Of course you can lose inches, body fat and weight by sitting in a confined area and eating mush 3 times a day. But what qualifies this as starving is the fact that your body has to cannabalize its muscle to survive. That is why starving people look so horrible. They have lost massive amounts of muscle in a short period of time. Many diets produce muscle loss, thus, starving your body. You will put more weight on when you go off the diet because you have lost muscle. Muscle fights fat, so when you lose muscle you lose a fat fighting mechanism.
- 3. Obsessing. One of the hall marks of a person with an eating problem is the desire to be perfect. So, many diets set people up for obsessing about numbers and food. This can create an abnormal attachment to food and to being perfect. What follows is the never-ending "starting over" problem. Thinking you've "blown it" can lead you to remain off your program all day so you can start over tomorrow which robs you of the good that can be done by just stopping right where you are and regrouping for a better end to the day at hand.
- 4. Looking for one solution. We would all agree that there are billions of dollars spent on diet items and services. The selling point is that once you have found whatever is being sold... you have the answer. Often this produces hopelessness as you try one thing after another and get no lasting results. There are ads suggesting "It's not your fault" (stress is the culprit) or "you just can't do it" (so surgery is the only way). There are no magic pills or diets. Even surgery isn't magic. The truth is that a multi-faceted, individualized approach to weight loss is more likely to achieve
- 5. Stuck thinking. Because one thing "worked" for a while doesn't mean it is the only answer. When you are teachable you are open to new possibilities. Getting out of the rut of numerous attempts to lose weight takes doing something different. It takes a whole new approach. And it takes working with someone who can be objective, educative and motivational to move you out of yourself and onto a new path.
- 6. Believing it is temporary. Many people just want to get the weight off. How many times have we all heard about the person who lost the weight, only to gain it back again? Generally speaking, if you have or have had a weight problem, you probably have a tendency in that direction. Long term habits and changes will be most important.
- 7. **Doing it alone.** There are many people who decide to lose weight and decide they won't tell anyone until they have lost a certain amount of weight. They think, "Who wants other people's opinions about this?" Realistically most people need some sort of accountability and motivation beyond themselves. By week three, most people quit when they are doing it on their own. So, doing it alone is asking for a greater challenge to the whole process. Do you really want to make it harder on yourself?

8. Denying your uniqueness. The truth is that you are unique and you have more than just one thing that has brought you to a place of dissatisfaction with your weight. That needs to be addressed with someone who has a lot of experience and who will give you a unique program designed just for you, given your past and present issues. Books and magazines don't know you by name.

9. Believing that you won't have to give up anything.

How many times have we seen that you can eat what you want and still lose weight? No one likes to think about giving up something they enjoy. But the truth is, once you exercise discipline, one day at a time, you won't want that thing you think is so precious now. Eventually you will see that it is holding you back from the joy of your ideal weight.

10. Believing that you won't have to do anything.

It is equally as important to have the discipline to avoid things that keep you fat as it is to take action. So many of us have read about weight loss or have watched the shows about weight loss on TV, but have never taken the necessary action or have never taken it long enough to matter. Knowledge is a very small part of the answer. Action is what really gets results!


