Hello Friends and Neighbors,

I mentioned in a previous message that we planned on having greater collaboration with GPNA (German-Paristown Neighborhood Association). You will see below an example of this as we work together to try to implement this project.

#### **PROCLAMATION**

WHEREAS: Our neighborhood is similar in nature to a "small town" located in the heart of the City.

WHEREAS: Goss Avenue is similar in nature to a Main Street located in a "small town".

WHEREAS: Goss Avenue is a short two-way street with the most vehicular, bike, and foot traffic in our neighborhood.

WHEREAS: Goss Avenue is the location of our largest and most used commercial establishment (Kroger).

WHEREAS: Goss Avenue is also the location of our most treasured and historic commercial establishment (Hauck's).

WHEREAS: Goss Avenue is, moreover, the location of the Germantown Square shopping center with two restaurants, the location of a pet shop, a tool repair shop, two hair salons, two pubs, a car repair shop, a convenient store, a pub/restaurant, a VFW post, a Paralyzed Veterans center, two plumbing shops, a barber, a whatnot shop, two restaurants, a child care, an antique mall, a law office, a recording studio, Volunteers of America, and a cabinet shop.

WHEREAS: Goss Avenue is exclusively located within our neighborhood.

WHEREAS: Goss Avenue has a speed limit of thirty-five miles per hour and currently has two stoplights.

WHEREAS: Goss Avenue is in need of a "Main Street" makeover/beautification project.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that our neighborhood would like to see, through a public/private partnership, some or all of the following ideas:

1) neighborhood signs/banners 2) neighborhood trash cans 3) hanging baskets/silk floral arrangements 4) landscaping at the Germantown Square medians 5) tree plantings and landscaping up and down the street 6) replace the guardrails at the corner of Texas and Goss with raised beds 7) traffic "calming" through the use of more stop signs, stoplights, and/or speed humps with an accompanying reduction in speed to twenty-five miles per hour 8) murals/outdoor art 9) antique street lamp posts 10) burying utility lines 11) landscaping at the railroad crossing 12) re-classification of zoning for the street to encourage more shops and pedestrian

re-classification of zoning for the street to encourage more shops and pedestrian traffic 13) a master plan or blueprint on paper incorporating some or all of these ideas.

Hello Neighbors! You may notice the Schnitzelburg logo has a cleaner, fresher appearance. We thought that our 40th anniversary year was a good time for a little makeover. Thank you to Creative Designer Scott Weber, a Schnitzelburg resident, for the update.

We will start to see more of the color green around us in the coming weeks as spring makes a gradual appearance. I hope that everyone is familiar with the works of GoGreen Germantown. We have planted over 70 trees and shrubs in Schnitzelburg over the past 3 years. One of our goals is to make the Eastern Redbud the "official" tree of Schnitzelburg and build a spring festival around the time that they bloom each year. The Redbud only reaches a mature height of 20-25 feet and is native to our area. It is on LG&E's approved list of street trees. The tree grows a taproot instead of a spreading root pattern, so it is unlikely to interfere with gas or water lines. # ART for Everybody

In case you haven't noticed, there's a new neighbor in the 'burg. **Art Sanctuary** moved to 1433 Shelby St. about a year ago and have spent much of that time undergoing renovations. They are now an official resident of the neighborhood. Art Sanctuary's mission is to support and foster the work of local artists by providing low cost studio space where artists can paint, rehearse, record, perform and exhibit their work. In addition to providing local artists a venue to showcase their work, the Art Sanctuary hopes to involve the community in the local art scene, and create connections between artists and the Louisville Metro community.

Lisa Frye is the President and founder of the Art Sanctuary. She started Art Sanctuary 10 years ago in her house on East St. Catherine Street. Frankie Steele joined Art Sanctuary last year and has been a driving force behind the purchase and renovation of the new Shelby Street location. The new location at Shelby Street should solve the space problem once and for all. The building, formerly the Precision Tool and Die Company, has 23,000 square feet of space including individual art studios, a photo studio with lighting and props, a small recording studio and office space for graphic artists who do not have enough space to work at home. Ms. Frye hopes to open an art gallery on the second floor in the near future. The event room on the bottom floor, which has a stage, can seat 130 people and can be rented for parties, wedding receptions, and concerts.

The Art Sanctuary is funded through donations, proceeds from events and studio rentals. If you would like to make a donation or serve as a volunteer to help paint or lend a hand with renovations or would like to find out more about the Art Sanctuary please contact:
