



We've Been Bombed!!!

If you were anywhere near the pool or clubhouse last summer, you might have noticed some new outdoor décor! It started with trees wrapped in colorful "sweaters" and flowers strewn across the fence. Then we saw American "flags" hanging along the Independence Day parade route! And finally a big yellow sunburst flanked on one side by a bright pink bikini and on the other side by a pair of green camo swim trunks! All of this "fiber art" appeared to be crocheted. So who's doing it - and why? After a little research, this is what we know about it. It's called "yarn bombing" and it started in Houston in 2005, when a woman renting an ugly downtown craft shop knitted a cozy to spruce up her door Before long a group of knitters and knob. crocheters had covered an entire street - enhancing everything from parking meters to park benches. The art form has spread world wide and now there is even an International Yarn Bombing Day every June! These guerilla knitters have been known to work as individuals or in groups and are taking their craft to the streets!

Why? To encourage people to see the beauty in their surroundings. Look at your environment in a different way. Maybe you'll notice things that you never saw before. Maybe it will give you something to talk about with people you've never met before. Maybe it will soften some of the metal and concrete. Maybe someone wants you to feel that same warmth and kindness that you experience when you've been given a hand knitted sweater or a crocheted scarf. Most "bombers" work anonymously and some are even sending out a message, so you might enjoy trying to solve the puzzle.

Will El Dorado get bombed this summer? I don't know – and if I did I'd never tell. But I'd keep an eye out!


you have forgotten – the curb is part of your yard and needs to be maintained.

When you mow your lawn, please remember to clean your curb and the street where your clippings fall. Keeping the curb clean on the street reduces that amount of weeds that can grow from your lawn's clippings.

Keeping your curb clean is important enough that Code Compliance has an ordinance against blowing the cuttings into the street. It is a violation. Some lawn service companies have been fined for blowing the cuttings into the street.

There are several weed and grass killers that are effective when used on weeds or grass on the street side of your curb. Lowe's and Home Depot offer two brands that are quite inexpensive — one is made by Bayer and the other is made by Ortho. These cost less than \$6.00 and in today's economy, that is a bargain. They come pre-mixed with a sprayer attached.

Be kind to your neighbor – clean your curb!

May 26th – 2:00 to 4:00 pm May 27th – 2:00 to 4:00 pm Jun 11th – 6:00 to 8:00 pm




