#### **Deed Restrictions**

Gulf Meadows is experiencing high volumes of FAST TRAFFIC and TRAFFIC JAMS all over the neighborhood, causing great concern for all. On Lettie and Springtime, where the new exits and entrances are located at Monroe, the traffic has become very dangerous for residents living in the 8400 blocks. On a daily basis, many vehicles leave or come into the neighborhood barreling down the streets at a very high rate of speed with no regard for children playing, residents trying to pull out of or into their driveways, or residents mowing, edging and/or sweeping up after doing their yards. IT HAS BECOME A TOTAL NIGHTMARE for our neighbors living near Monroe.

ADDITIONALLY, to add to our problems in the neighborhood, too many residents are parking their cars on the streets as opposed to using their own driveways or garages. Some single home residents have as many as six to eight cars on the street. This parking problem hinders emergency vehicles from enterina neighborhood. An issue this serious could determine the difference between life/death situations based solely on the time it takes to reroute emergency help. Please help us out with these issues. We urge you to SLOW DOWN and DRIVE SAFELY for your safety and others around you. We also urge you to park in YOUR GARAGES and on YOUR DRIVEWAYS, but please DO NOT PARK ON THE GRASS!

# **Heavy Trash Program**

The Heavy Trash Program requires that you separate tree waste from other types of junk waste. The heavy trash schedule changes each month from tree waste to junk waste. Tree waste will not be picked up if you combine it with any type of junk waste. Junk waste is defined as furniture, appliances and other bulky material (lumber, fence material, etc.). Appliances containing refrigerant must have a tag attached to them certifying that a qualified technician has removed the refrigerant. These items should be placed adjacent to the front curb, easily accessible to the collection vehicle between the hours of 6:00 p.m. the Friday before and 7:00 a.m. on the scheduled collection day (4<sup>th</sup> Monday of each month). Heavy trash put out too early or mixed with Tree Waste/Junk Waste not picked up will be reported to 311 and you will be fined by the City of Houston. We need to keep our neighborhood clean.
