LET'S CELEBRATE OUR ASSETS

It is becoming a trend again to have homes built close together, close to the streets, with front porches, and narrow streets. Trendy areas are encouraging people to walk and use bicycles to get physically fit again and to take advantage of local businesses in the area.

Does this sound like our area?

We have a real asset in our neighborhood, let's celebrate and bring back the "good neighborly feeling" to the community. We can work on updating our properties and be considered trendy!

This area is very fortunate to have a wonderful system of streets, alleys, and close connection to many businesses that can help to expand the mobility of everyone.

Whether you choose to walk, bicycle, or drive to get supplies from our area, you can select several routes. Because of the price of gas, this is another real asset. People who live in walk able communities are also quite likely to be much healthier.

Streets are an extension of your home, they make up much of the fabric of the community, and they are vital transportation facilities—not just for motorists, but also for pedestrians, bicyclists, and users of public transportation. Streets are worth the fight to make them safe and accommodating to everyone.

The goal of the successful walking community is to make driving more of a hassle than to walk for the same task even if at the same distance.

Bloomingdale is the 5th most walk able neighborhood in Fort Wayne with 3,414 residents.

Bloomingdale is somewhat bike able.

The first thing to understand is that the public peace – the sidewalk and street peace – of cities is not kept primarily by the police, necessary as police are. It is kept primarily by an intricate, almost unconscious, network of voluntary controls and standards among the people themselves, and enforced by the people themselves.

For a street to serve its community well, there must be "eyes on the street", enough people paying attention to what is happening on the street. To achieve this, "the sidewalk must have users on it fairly continuously, or have people in buildings along the street watching."

When no one is paying attention to "quality of life" violations then this is when neglect creates an opening for more serious crime.

Many of the simple pleasures of daily life—walking casually down the street, enjoying the scenery, bumping into friends, getting to know neighbors by seeing them over and over again can be enjoyed in our Bloomingdale Neighborhood because of our great asset of connecting streets, alleys, concerned community people, and close businesses available to our homes.

Happiness comes through doors you didn't even know you left open.

What makes a neighborhood walkable?

- A center: Walkable neighborhoods have a center, whether it's a main street or a public space.
- People: Enough people for businesses to flourish and for public transit to run frequently.
- **Mixed income, mixed use:** Affordable housing located near businesses.
- Parks and public space: Plenty of public places to gather and play.
- Pedestrian design: Buildings are close to the street, parking lots are relegated to the back.
- Schools and workplaces: Close enough that most residents can walk from their homes.

Some have been getting out and running loose.





Here are some tips to help make your home as inviting on the outside as it is on the inside:


- Make a statement at the door. It sets the tone for your home's exterior and gives others their first impression of your home.




It was exciting and hopefully the time is getting closer to when this project will be finished.


Reasons why the **raves and rants** in the newspapers are so fun to read, but why the rants are not really accurate and logical.
