Double Stabbing at South Jeffco Residence

Jefferson County, CO. – On May 13, 2013 at 8:25 a.m., deputies responded to 7835 W. Ontario Pl. on a report of a man lying in the front yard. The man, later identified as Michael Schreiber (dob 020334), was bleeding from the chest from a stab wound. A search of the residence discovered Michael's wife, Sandra Lee Schreiber (dob 071343), suffering from a stab wound as well. It was quickly determined that the incident was contained within the residence, and occurred solely between Michael and Sandra. They were both transported to Littleton Hospital where Michael was pronounced dead a short time later. Through the course of the investigation, it was determined that Sandra stabbed Michael, and that Sandra's wound was self-inflicted. Sandra is still hospitalized. A mug shot and initial court date are pending her release from the hospital, at which time she will be booked into the Jeffco jail for first degree murder. - Jeffco Sheriff Dept. The street was cordoned off with police crime tape from approximately 9am til early afternoon. Traffic that usually uses Ontario Pl. to exit the neighborhood was turned around and detoured to another exit.

"Questions? Questions?"

"Dr. Stevenson, I am a parent living in the Columbine West subdivision, home to Dutch Creek Elementary. I noticed a newly installed intercom at the front door by the badge screener. Please help myself and others in our community to understand this particular means of security. Thank you for your time and I look forward to hearing from you or another representative soon."

Dr. Stevenson's reply:

Thank you for your correspondence regarding the secured entry system at Dutch Creek Elementary. Jeffco is always researching and working to implement best practices in school safety and security and school secure entries are part of this ongoing process. Many of our schools have installed and been using secured entry systems over the last few years. These pilot systems have proven effective in helping to keep our schools safe while still maintaining a welcoming environment. Below are specific talking points our Communications department has provided to school staff, parents and community members regarding Jeffco school safety:

Jeffco Public Schools follows national best practices in safety and security and is a leader in implementing new safety protocols. Secure entry front systems will be installed at all elementary and middle schools during the 2012-13 and 2013-14 school years. Visitors will be required to have verbal and visual contact with someone in the main office before they are allowed to enter the school. Ensure that there is one main entrance and put up signage identifying it as the main entrance. Maintain visible signage on campus and on all school doors directing visitors to the main entrance door. All schools must have a visitor sign-in, sign-out log, which is signed by the visitor. They must be given a visitors ID badge to wear. Parents, guardians or friends who come to pick up students during the day must sign out the child in the office. Add this information to your school newsletter and other forms of parent communications. Jeffco has an emergency dispatch center which is open 24-hours a day, seven days week including holidays. The dispatch center has two-way communications with the law enforcement agencies that support our schools. Jeffco has security personnel that patrol the district 24-hours a day, seven days a week. There are school resource officers in every Jeffco high school and many middle schools. These are police officers who are armed and assigned to a school. The district has a strong partnership with Safe2Tell – an anonymous reporting program that allows anyone to report threatening behaviors in schools or in the community. €More than 63,000 students and 7,000 staff members have been trained during the 2012-13 school year in emergency preparedness including lockdown, lockout and evacuation drills. Every Jeffco school has a security plan. Jeffco was the first school district to implement the Standard Response Protocol (SRP). It's a program that uses common language between students, staff and first responders when describing actions to be taken in the event of an emergency. €The SRP is nationally recognized as a best practice in emergency situations.

You can see that the secured entries are part of an ongoing comprehensive school safety and security vision in Jeffco. 

See You at the Recycling/ Dumpster Day & Local Food Drive

When: Saturday, June 8th, 8 a.m. - 12 p.m.

Where: Church for All Nations, 6500 W. Coal Mine Ave. (east of McDonalds). Entrance to event is from Marshall St only. Do not enter through the McDonald's driveway. From Coal Mine, turn south on Marshall St. (by Shiloh House). From Pierce St., turn east on Ottawa St. (by Angie's Restaurant).

Cost: CWCA Members - FREE

Columbine West Non-CWCA Members: \$25 Cash or Check Only – No Credit Cards accepted.

Must have picture ID with valid Columbine West address or proof of address from a current Xcel bill. This event is open only to residents of Columbine West.

We will have on-site document shredding, metal recycling, electronic recycling, and trash trucks for dumping items that don't fit into any of the other categories. Having it all in one place on one day increases efficiency while saving residents time and hassle. CWCA is excited to sponsor this event, which helps keep our neighborhood clean and safe, through the Columbine West membership dues.

We are also collecting canned goods and/or non-perishable goods which will be donated to the Open Arms food bank which helps support those in need in our community.

Examples of acceptable recycling and/or dumping items are as follows: **Document Shredding:** Financial records, tax returns, bank/credit card statements, cancelled checks, other paper documents with personal information. **Metal Recycling:** Metal, aluminum, copper, cords/strings of lights, auto batteries, lawn mowers, microwaves, dishwashers, washers/dryers, stoves, refrigerators, small appliances, silverware, cast iron cookware, tools, DVDs, VCRs, barbeque grills, computer accessories. **Electronic Recycling:** TVs, computer monitors. **Dumpsters (Trash Trucks):** branches, bushes, doors, windows, scrap lumber, anything you would take to the dump.

The drop off stations will be set up in the order above. If you have items for more than one station, load your vehicle in the reverse order so that the documents are the first thing to unload, the metal items next, then electronics, and finally things for the dumpster. It will make it easier to motor through the stations and help facilitate the flow of traffic. Volunteers will be on hand to help unload.

Remember, you can make as many trips as you want within the 4-hour event. If you would like to volunteer to help, please call the voice mail line at 303 904-8218 and leave your name and number. We look forward to seeing you there.

One Minute Wellness... Summertime

Summer is a time when everyone has a higher risk of injury due to increased outdoor activities. Many injuries can be prevented by practicing general safety tips, good hydration, flexibility training and joint or structural support. Joint support can be achieved through strengthening exercises, the use of sports taping and the use of supplements. Creams such as Arniflora, Traumeel, and Arnica Spray are great for preventing and treating shin splints or for local inflammatory injuries. These products are not to be used on open skin wounds or sores.

An injury is termed chronic when it lasts longer than a given length of time and/or is reoccurring. The acute phase of an injury may last weeks. Generally, the first 24 hours is the most important phase of injury in terms of healing because early intervention can make a difference in the length of total recovery. Generally, ice is used in the early phase of strains and sprains. After a day or so, heat can be introduced. Ice and heat packs should not be placed directly against the skin. The use of a cloth or towel is usually enough to prevent burning of the skin from either ice or heat. Most health sources recommend icing and heating for only 20 minutes at a time.

Resuming activities can be tricky and when rushed can lead to chronic problems. Sometimes symptoms can become flared once activities are resumed. Although this is frustrating, it is expected and is usually temporary.

Correct footwear is essential to support the joints and spine. Some athletic shoe stores, such as The Boulder Running Company, will get you on a treadmill and video your walking or running stride as a free service. This can provide valuable information in terms of foot plant and correction (with insoles and/or sport specific shoes).

If your shoes are from last summer you may want to consider getting some new shoes. Take notice of where your shoes are worn. That is often the best clue as to your natural stride. Remember, people who participate in outdoor activities such as walking or running wear down their shoes much faster and should consider buying new shoes every 6 months. Lastly, cheaper isn't always better when it comes to injury prevention. One bad turn and you could be in for a long ride of recovery. Improper shoes can lead to such things as Plantar Fasciitis, a painful foot disorder. Honor your feet and they will honor your entire body!


