


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#### Important Voicemail Line Information

A letter was recently received by a concerned homeowner. "Attention Columbine West Board, Why do residents leave their garage doors open? There are at least 3 people on our block that rarely close their garage doors. It is understandable when working in the yard that you might need access to tools, etc. But doors are left open hours after the work has been completed. People returning home from work open their garage doors to drive their car in, and then leave the door open for hours, some even all night. We have seen cars slowing down as they pass open garage doors, looking inside as they pass. Are they looking to see what is stored in the garage, or are they watching to see if the door to the house is left unlocked? Are they noting routines and opportunities to return to steal something? They are inviting crime into our neighborhood and are putting their neighbors at risk. While criminals are in the neighborhood, they will look for as many opportunities as possible to make their efforts fruitful. Is that fair to those that live next to or nearby? We have checked with our insurance company and others and have been told that individual insurance policies may NOT cover losses due to resident's negligence to secure their property properly. Please help us alert Columbine West residents and urge them to be Good Neighbors as you advocate in your newsletter." ### Hot Crime Trend—Will Your Garage be Burglarized this Year?

If you leave your garage door unlocked or open, likely the answer is 'yes'. The amount of garage door burglaries in Jefferson County is quite alarming. But when you consider that 90 percent of the garage burglaries since January (77 total) were due to open or unlocked garage doors, the sheriff's office gives serious thought to residents' intentions. We need your help! Quite frequently our deputies avert criminal's deeds by alerting residents that their garage door is open; we've been known to knock on doors late in the evening. We are asking neighbors to please alert each other to the danger. If you see an open garage door perhaps they aren't aware they left it open. Also concerning is that once inside the garage it's likely just as easy to gain access to the interior of the home as those doors are often unlocked too! Please pay special attention to your home, and make sure all doors, windows and garage doors are locked and in good workin g order. Security lighting and good communication with your neighbors are excellent deterrents to such criminal activity.

#### One Minute Wellness... Supplements

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#### Columbine Kiwanis at Bandimere

In 1958, John Bandimere Sr. purchased a parcel of land on the west side of Denver nestled up against the Hogback leading up to the Rocky Mountains. He and his family began the process of constructing a small but efficient drag strip that was to be used to augment their auto parts business. It also was the fulfillment of a dream of John Sr.'s to provide a safe environment for young people to learn about cars and race them off the streets. Over 50 years later, the only thing at Bandimere Speedway that has not changed is the facility's location. Nearly every original building has been replaced including the original spark plug-replica timing tower and the event schedule has grown nearly 10 times its original size to host a variety of specialty events, including the NHRA Full Throttle Mopar Mile-High Nationals. The ability to host larger spectator events added a tremendous amount of exposure opportunities for the facility and its sponsors. Seating capacity of the grandstands was increased from approximately 8,000 to over 23,500. The track has several quirks that make it unique within the NHRA's schedule of events. First, and foremost, is the altitude. At over 5,000 feet in the air, the air is much thinner than any if its sealevel counterparts, which translates out to less air being pushed over the rear wings, and a loss of downforce, the thinner air also slows the cars down dramatically, a 330 mph run on any other track would barely top 320 at Bandimere. Columbine Kiwanis have a major fundraiser each year during the speedway races, they come together with high school Key Club members to sell fountain drinks.

Columbine Kiwanis is group of volunteers dedicated primarily to children in our local community. We also have fun at our meetings which include an interesting speaker and social events.
