SKUNK REMEDY. Those pesky skunks have been seen (and smelled) lately in our neighborhood. Here is a possible solution you may want to try if your pet has been sprayed: mix together 1 quart of peroxide, ¼ cup baking soda and 1 TBSP Dawn dishwashing soap. Apply to your pet, but be careful. Don't leave it on your pet for more than 10-15 minutes and don't get it in the pet's eyes. Using a wash cloth may control the flow of the liquid. Thoroughly rinse this mixture off of your pet and then shampoo with whatever you normally use on your pet.
