The voter registration application is also available for download at www.fultonelections.com. Simply complete it, print it, sign it and mail it to the address provided on the form.

Check Your Voter Registration Status

All registered voters should ensure their information on file is up-to-date by logging into the Georgia Secretary of State's My Voter Page at http://mvp.sos.state.ga.us/

New Fulton County residents who are

registered to vote elsewhere in Georgia should complete a new voter registration form to update their name and/or address. New Fulton County residents who are registered to vote in other states must complete a Georgia voter registration form to vote.

Information for Newly Registered Voters

Newly registered voters in Fulton County who are still awaiting a voter registration card should know that this delay is due to the implementation of new technology used by the Georgia Secretary of State's office.

The State of Georgia is in the process of transitioning to a new voter registration system that will place all 159 counties into one centralized database. This process has caused processing delays for new registration cards. Fulton County has registered more than 5,000 new voters in September alone. Newly registered Fulton County voters who are awaiting a voter registration card can check their voter registration status online at the Georgia Secretary of State's My Voter Page.

Voting By Mail (Absentee Ballot)

Fulton County voters who prefer to vote by absentee ballot can submit their written request for an absentee ballot now. Friday, November 1, 2013 is the last day to request an Absentee ballot for the November 5, 2013 election. Voters do not have to provide a reason for voting absentee by mail.

How to Request An Absentee Ballot

Online: Download an Absentee Ballot application from the Department of Registration & Elections website. By Phone: Call 404-612-7060 to request that an Absentee Ballot Application be mailed to you. In Person: You can also request and complete an Absentee Ballot Application at any of the three Fulton County Department of Registration & Elections Offices.

Voters can also write a letter requesting an absentee ballot. The letter must include all of the following: name and date of the election, the voter's name, address as registered, date of birth, address where the ballot is to be mailed, daytime phone number (optional), and voter's signature.

Mail your Absentee Ballot Application or letter requesting an absentee ballot to: Fulton County Registration & Elections, Attn: Absentee Ballot, 130 Peachtree St., SW, Suite 2186, Atlanta, GA 30303 You can fax your letter or application to 404-730-8839.

All Absentee Ballots must be returned to the Department of Registration & Elections no later

than 7 p.m. on Election Day, November 5.
