7:00 p.m. Dutch Creek Elementary Sept 10th, Oct 8th, Nov. 12th After receiving the much needed rain that we normally expect to fall in the early summer months, its refreshing, but also difficult to plan for those end of the summer landscape projects. Being environmentally conscious goes beyond philosophy and extends into our methods and practices. Proactive approaches to protecting the health and vigor of plants include early detection of problems, careful selection of insect and disease control and proper application and limits on pesticide usuage. It can be pivitol to the health and wellbeing of your landscape to have proper pruning standards to direct growth and improve the natural structure of plants. All of this will enhance your landscapes aesthetics, strength and longevity. Fall is the preferred time to take extra care of some of your most valued landscape items: trees and bushes. As you

prepare for Fall, take a look around your property and note whether you need to plan some pruning or trimming. If you live on a corner, make sure no road signage, (ie. stop signs) is blocked from view. County officals can be contacted by the association to trim a tree or bush that is blocking a sign and it will be at the homeowners expense. Remember that when branches are loaded with snow they will hang lower to the sidewalks. Trees that are heavily disease damaged can break apart under snow load or heavy winds. Most homeowers insurance policies will not pay claims if proper steps were neglected in keeping the landscape safe. Each yard within Columbine West is of recognizable value to another, lets keep them safe, healthy and beautiful. The association strives to see our community defined by a sense of shared ownership and collective responsibility. Anyone can attend a monthly meeting, held on the second Tuesday, 7p at Dutch Creek Elementary. Drop by, say hello, bring questions to the Board or possibly volunteer to help on a project. All neighbors are welcomed and encouraged to attend and get involved. One of CWCA's Mission statements is - To initiate civic programs that bring the community together and encourage residents to maintain the general appearance of Columbine West.

A Moment With The Board

The one Board position plus the officers of Vice Pres. & Sec. are still available. The membership report has a current total of 381 members, with an budgeted goal of 454, that puts us at 84% of our goal. In dollars that equates to an \$1825 shortfall to the budget. Have you become a member yet? Last years budget was based on a goal of 420 members, we had 388 paid memberships in Oct. 2012, representing a 92% targeted goal. That was a budget shortfall of \$800 in 2012. The Budget Committee will be gathering ideas for discussion on the 2014 CWCA Budget, at the Oct. 8th mtg. Police Activity in Columbine West

On Wednesday, September 18th the corner of Webster/Frost was closed off due to police presence. Many rumors were heard throughout the neighborhood. CWCA Board members asked Jeffco personnel for whatever information they could give out. It was reported that there had not been any explosion at the property, but that S.W.A.T had used reasonable means to enter the property. Crime Scene investigators were gathering whatever was needed within the property to help them process the scene. It was suspected that the street would reopen by the weekend. Law enforcement officials were grateful for neighbors being patient with their investigation and reassured those who asked that there was no immediate danger to the community. Thank you

Code Red, Why are We Calling You?

In Jefferson County, the CodeRED system (sometimes called "reverse 911") allows us to call citizens to warn them of danger. With it, we can simultaneously call multiple phones within an area that we designate, to warn residents of flood, fire, tornadoes, chemical spills, or dangerous suspects. Within moments, calls reach the affected community to deliver warnings and critical safety instructions. If you receive an CodeRED call, the voice on the line will let you know it's a message from the Sheriff's Office. Also, your caller ID should display our agency's name and a call-back number. The CodeRED system works with all phones that have a TDD line (for the hearing impaired). If you have a telephone zapper used to block out telemarketers, or if your phone is blocked to unknown callers, you will not receive CodeRED calls.

Behind the Badge: Phone Scammer Pretends To Be From Sheriff's Office

On September 2nd and 3rd of 2013, the Jefferson County Sherriff's Office received over ten reports from citizens who received phones calls from a man pretending to be a Major with the Sheriff's Office. The man introduced himself as "Major Tom Wilson," and told the victims that they had missed jury duty and were going to be arrested.

The suspect told the victims they could avoid going to jail if they would go to Wal-Mart or Walgreens and buy \$500 "Green Dot MoneyPak" cards. The cards would supposedly cover the fines for failing to appear for jury duty. The suspect instructed the victim to buy the cards, scratch off the numbers on the back, and provide those numbers to the suspect. Anyone the cardholder shares the number with, has instant access to the cash.

Green Dot MoneyPak cards are reloadable debit cards, commonly available, which can be used to pay phone, cable, or credit card bills. They're typically for people who don't have bank accounts. Scammers like them because they're more convenient than a money wire, but just as untraceable. The cards are not linked to bank accounts – the money is on the card.

One of the victims, an at-risk adult, followed the instructions and actually provided the card numbers to the suspect. The Sheriff's Office will never call a citizen and ask for payment of any kind.

If you received a call similar to this and have yet to report it, you are encouraged to do so by calling 303-271-0211. If you have information about these crimes, you are asked to call the Sheriff's Office tip line at 303-271-5612.

Lichen Peak Trail Opens

The above-it-all experience of North Table Mountain Park has been elevated. With the completion of the Lichen Peak Trail, visitors have access to the highest point in the park.

A jaunt up the 0.2-mile trail invites visitors to get in touch with North Table Mountain's volcanic past and living present. Lava flows formed North Table Mountain and its sister mesa South Table Mountain about 60 million years. Basalt rock forms the cap of 6,575-foot Lichen Peak.

The hardscrabble area known as the Lichen Peak Garden is habitat for lichen, formed by a symbiotic relationship between single-celled algae and fungus. Algae and fungus "take a lichen to each other," as one recent park visitor put it, creating growth on the rocks. Lichen may survive in some of the most barren and severe regions of the earth, growing at rates as slow as 1 mm per year. Yet

> lichen are extremely susceptible to destruction by crushing and trampling.

> For preservation of the ecosystem, a narrow, hiker-only trail was constructed. To build a stairway to the top, Jeffco Open Space utilized a high-line system to carry in rock slabs from a quarry that once operated on the mesa top.

> "Stay on Trail" signs mark the path. Interpretive signs will allow visitors to better understand what makes this area of North Table Mountain Park so unique.

Flood Damage Closes Several Jeffco Open Space Parks and Trails

The extreme mid-September floods have damaged parks and trails throughout Jefferson County Open Space, resulting in full closures at Apex Park and Lair o' the Bear Park and limited access to other areas.

The Lair o' the Bear Park closure includes the Bear Creek Trail segment connecting to Pence Park, O'Fallon Park and Corwina Park within the Denver Mountain Parks system.

White Ranch Park and North Table Mountain Park were also heavily affected. The east trailhead at White Ranch Park is closed, along with the Sourdough Campground and portions of the Rawhide, Belcher Hill, Longhorn and Mustang Trails. At North Table Mountain Park, the Mesa Top Trail is closed from the east junction of the Rim Rock Trail to the North Table Mountain Loop and the North Table Mountain Loop is closed from Tilting Mesa Trail to Cottonwood Canyon Trail.

The west section of Wild Iris Loop at Alderfer Three Sisters Park, from Buffalo Creek Road to its juncture with Evergreen Mountain West, is also closed.

Heavy rain from a previous storm damaged South Valley Park, and the most recent rainfall flooded Mount Galbraith Park and Windy Saddle Park. The Lyons Back and Coyote Song Trails at South Valley Park were most affected, along with the Mt. Galbraith Loop at Mt. Galbraith Park. Windy Saddle Park was damaged throughout.

Jeffco Open Space encourages visitors to use parks south of Interstate 70, which were not as heavily damaged except for Lair o' the Bear Park and the Bear Creek area. Once Jeffco Open Space staff members finish assessing the damage, they will determine the best strategy for repairing the parks and trails. Reclamation will likely continue into spring 2014. 

Or, surrounding neighbors having loud parties until the wee hours of the morning, or, my lovely alcoholic neighbors out in the driveway or street fighting in the middle of the night numerous times a month. Believe me, the sheriff has been called for these occurances, but, after being awakened by these rude incidents, it is hard to go back to sleep. Or, the neglected yards in the area. Let's see, chickens or... I hope that we are being careful what we are complaining about. To all our valued neighbors, the above mentioned issues are outside of CWCA's control. Barking dogs is an issue dealt with by Animal Control and neighbors having loud parties, fighting and or drunk are definitely an issue for the Sheriff's dept. Neglected yards are not covered under our covenants unless we want to start citing the nuisance covenant, then we would have to be consistent and cite all of them in Columbine West. Which would be more work for the already taxed handful of association volunteers.

In either case, it is best that neighbors report problems directly to the proper authorities as they have the necessary information and can answer questions. CWCA does not have authority to resolve any of the above mentioned problems. Lastly, CWCA has no choice but to enforce the chicken covenant because that is what is currently recorded with Jefferson County. Thank you for writing in and giving us an opportunity to clarify some preconcieved misperceptions.
