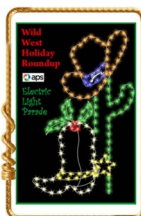

One of the biggest free holiday celebrations in the state returns to Phoenix with the APS Electric Light Parade on **Saturday, Dec. 7**. The theme for the 2013 parade is "Wild West Holiday Roundup." The event features more than 60 illuminated entries, including custom floats, marching bands, performance groups and more.

The parade gets underway at 7 p.m. on Central Avenue at Montebello (just south of Bethany Home Road). It then heads south on Central to Camelback Road, where it will turn east to Seventh Street then turn south and end at Indian School Road.

Residents can recycle Christmas trees

Phoenix residents may drop off Christmas trees and wreaths the

day after Christmas until early January. When bringing in your tree, remember to:

- Bring the tree unbagged.
- Remove all decorations, lights and tinsel.
- Remove the tree stand and all nails and metal stakes.
- Secure tree during transport. Tie it down with material that can be untied or cut easily.
- Only dispose of trees in marked drop-off areas.
- Sites accept single trees from city of Phoenix residents. For multiple tree loads, contact 602-262-7251. You can drop off your tree at Cactus Park, 38th Avenue and Cactus Road.

Wrapping paper and gift bags: What can be recycled?



Holiday wrapping papers soon will

be strewn all over living room floors. And with that scenario comes the question, "Which should be thrown and which should be recycled?"

Most holiday wrappers and greeting cards can be placed in your blue recycling containers, but there are exceptions. The following cards and wrapping materials **should not** be placed in your recycling bins:

- Foil-embossed papers
- Plastic wrap (from gift baskets)
- Ribbons or bows
- Materials with glitter

Gift-givers are encouraged to reuse gift bags and wrappers or use craft paper, newspapers and comics pages to wrap presents.

We have a nice neighborhood with property values going up. If you want to keep up your neighborhood it's time to get involved.

If you see suspicious activities call 911. If you have other problems there are important phone numbers on page 11.

Note: People will steal anything. Someone just stole new plants I just planted in my yard! Who would have thought someone would do that?? Protect your valuables and property.



Burglary Prevention By Community Action Officer Karen Freund

I often receive calls from residents who were "almost victims" who want to know how to protect themselves. Most of the advice I can give you is common sense tips, but sometimes we get so busy, we need to be reminded. Lock the doors to your house! Don't hide keys outside. Check to make sure you or your kids haven't left a window unlocked or open. Do you have a doggie door large enough for someone to crawl through or reach up through to unlock the door?

Are the gates to the backyard locked? If you are afraid of access to your backyard, have you planted something "unfriendly" to discourage entry? **Continued on page 9**

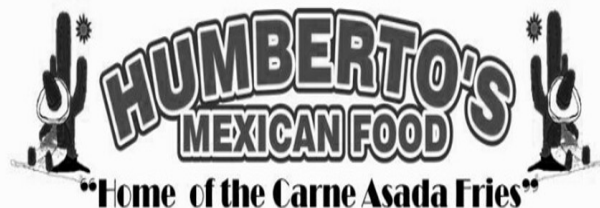

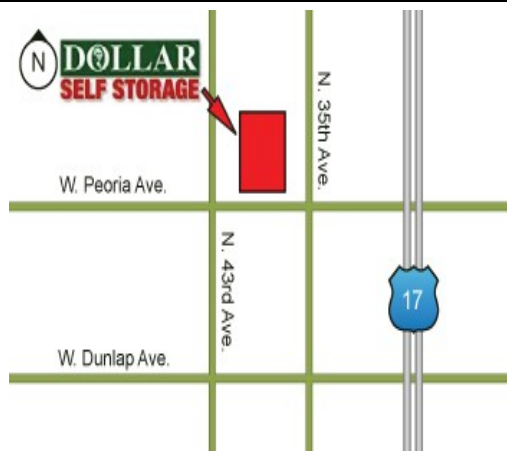

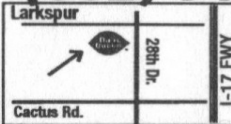

Do you have deadbolt locks? Do you have motion sensor lights to alert you when someone enters the yard?

Do you have a Block Watch on your street? Good neighbors are the best deterrent to crime. If you keep an eye on your neighbor's house, they'll keep an eye on your house. If you want to get one started, call me at **602-495-5035**

If you are the victim of a crime, call **Crime Stop at 602-262-6151** and report it. If you see a crime occurring, call **911**.

How can you assist the Phoenix Police Department in helping your neighborhood?

Know the difference between 911 and Crime Stop: 602-262-6151. Call 911 for Emergencies. Use Crime Stop when you want to report unusual or suspicious activities.

Be willing to take contact from an officer. Oftentimes an officer will not even be dispatched if you are not willing to take contact. An officer driving down the street in a fully marked patrol car is pretty easy to spot. When an officer is responding to a call, the person they are looking for can usually see them coming and leave the area or hide. If the officer can stop by and talk to you, you might be able to tell them where the suspicious person/people are now located. If you are really uncomfortable with an officer coming to your door, tell the operator you will take contact by phone. Although this slows the process down a little bit, it can work.

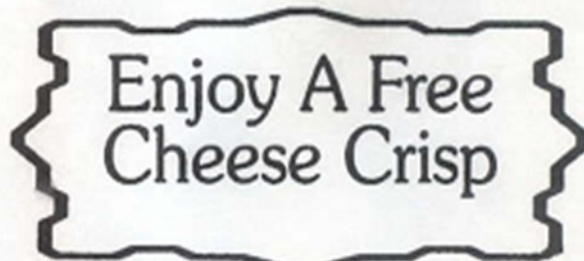
