

## "Participation - that's what's gonna save the human race." - Pete Seeger

Hi, neighbor.

I volunteered to write a column about gardening, nutrition, GMOs, and everything related. Whole, real foods, as they apply to wellness and health is a passion of mine, and I hope that I can help start a conversation about growing our own food, creating and sustaining a community garden(s) in our area, and also bringing us closer together as a community by doing so.

Nothing brings people together like food... Remember food? It was whole, individual ingredients, not already prepared meals in a box, ready to heat and eat. Maybe your folks even pulled some vegetables from their own garden when you were a kid. We, as a whole, have gotten so far removed from our food and sources that some people don't even know where their food really comes from, what it takes to get that food from farm to plate, or even how their meat is treated and raised – or where it was raised, for that matter. Do you know if the beef you buy was fed a diet of grains and corn meal, antibiotics, and steroids, or was it pastured raised and grass fed with no hormones or drugs? Do you know if the vegetables you eat were sprayed with a myriad of toxins so dangerous that farmers have to wear hazmat suits and respirators to walk among them, or were they grown organically, with care and attention? All of this matters.

When I was a kid in the 70s, we still ate real food. As the 80s came in and life got busier, more households had both parents working jobs to keep the American Dream alive. Food became faster and more processed in the 80s and continued in that direction until we started buying most of our food in boxes; prepared meals from the freezer section; or meals that were picked up in a drive thru on the way home from work. Think back to the time when we ate real, whole foods, and compare it to what we eat now - which isn't really food, but food-like substances... Notice that the change in our food system has also been reflected in the change in our health - how many people now struggle with diseases like fibromyalgia, diabetes, and cancer, versus how many had those illnesses 30 years ago? 40 years ago? 50 years ago? Of course environment, genetics, and lifestyle certainly factor into the equation, but some of those things we cannot change. What we CAN change is what we choose to put into our bodies. The food we eat can either be the strongest form of medicine or the slowest form of poison.

It is a sad state we are in health-wise, due to a lot of what we are putting into our bodies, albeit unknowingly. Our food supply over the decades has gone from garden fresh to fresh forever, and it's what they put in our foods to keep them "fresh" that is killing Along with preservatives, additives, questionable ingredients (beaver poop makes strawberry flavoring, did you know that!?), our "food" is now chock-full of genetically modified organisms (GMOs), which are foods made in laboratories, not in nature. GMOs were created to help crops grow bigger, faster; to withstand heavy saturation of pesticides; some produce their own pesticides (Google bt toxins, Monsanto, GMOs, and glyphosate for more in-depth information). I will write more in the future on GMOs and our food supply, but I trust you will take it upon yourself to look it up and see what it's all about in the meantime. It should concern you. You're eating them every day. It doesn't have to be that way.

You can choose to avoid those toxic food-like substances. You can get to know your local farmers and buy directly from them. There are CSA's and co-ops, produce stores and farmers markets, daily and on the weekends. We can grow our own. We can grow together, share, and trade. Working together and caring for each other is what it's going to take to get our country back on track, and this is a great place to start — with family, friends, and neighbors. I have some ideas about where we could start a community garden in our neighborhood. Maybe you do, too. Let's talk about it, and see what we can do, shall we? Peace.





# Landscaping/Gardening Tips Jack Eli, Little Leaf Grounds Services

March is the traditional start of spring in the San Antonio area. Here's hoping it is a wet one. It is also a busy time for gardeners.

If you haven't cut back the freeze damaged perennials, now is the time to do it. Cut back to green wood on woody perennials and cut to ground level on the others, such as Lantanas for example. After cutting back your perennials it is also a great time to mulch around them.

As cool as the weather has been you still have a little time to apply a pre-emergent, if you haven't yet, but try to get it down as soon as possible for it to be fully effective. It is still too early to apply fertilizer, you should wait until the first week of April. Use a fertilizer with a 3-1-2 ratio and it should be a slow release formulation.

Mowing the lawn for the first time takes place just when you see the first green shoots. You can lower your mower as much as half an inch for the first cut. Spring is also the best time to aerate and top dress your lawn. Be sure to use a dressing that is washed sand and compost. The washed sand removes any clay which the San Antonio area soils already have more than enough of.

Annual flowers for color should be available at local nurseries so go take a look. Most of the varieties available now will not make it through our hot summers but you can get several months of good color. Summer annuals usually become available in late April or early May depending on species.

Your onions should already be in the garden. If not, you need to hurry. The first week of March is a great time to plant tomatoes. Be sure to mulch well.
