HANAWALT HAS A NEW TRACK!

The Hanawalt community (school staff, PTA, and surrounding community) wanted a notable way to celebrate the school Centennial, and did so by raising funds for a track that the whole neighborhood can use! Because health and well-being are becoming more and more a focus for school leadership, staff, and PTA members, programs have been implemented within the school that provide students with greater access to nutritious foods and greater opportunities to stay active.

The PTA and school community believed constructing a track, improving the lawn (field), and upgrading the active courts was a good first step. The track will provide the Hanawalt KidStriders program a place to flourish outdoors, the field will provide the students and community with a Great Lawn for active and passive play, and the courts will serve as an area to be active during good and not so good weather. All three of these improvements were focused on getting kids and the community active. Stop by to see the work that has been done, or put on your running shoes and try it out!



















WESTWOOD BENCH PROJECT

Soon, while walking along the bike path you will see three new park benches.

These benches, made of steel and attached to a concrete base will state "Welcome to Westwood Neighborhood" - a sincere greeting to all the users of the trail. This campaign to enhance the Walnut Creek Trail started last spring, when a group of neighbors approached the WNA with the project. A committee formed, led by Margo Hutcheson to make the vision of having locations along the trail to take a break, tie a shoe, or just enjoy nature, a reality.

The committee learned of outside funds available, a Community Betterment Grant was written and awarded to Westwood with the intention "to provide quality services to the citizens of Polk County." We think this project does just that! Then the fundraising at the local level started. The generosity of neighbors is overwhelming - and so appreciated. We have raised all the money needed to completely fund this project, which was over \$5,700. The benches have been ordered, the concrete slabs will soon be poured and hopefully the weather will cooperate and the benches will be fully installed by year's end.

A LETTER FROM COUNCILMEMBER HENSLEY REGARDING THE GRAND AVE BRIDGE

Living on 55th Street, just off the Grand Avenue Bridge detour, I fully understand the frustration we all feel as it relates to the various setbacks this project has faced. Therefore I wanted to share with you some additional information from the various aspects I have been involved with throughout the project

There is no question traffic flow has been an issue both on the detour route and the routes taken by citizens that are other than the signed detour route. I can see the impact on Pleasant and 56th, as I am eating dinner in our dining room which looks right out onto 56th. South of Grand, North Valley Drive, 51st Street and Robertson Drive have also been issues as it relates to traffic. I actually stood in the front yard of Amy MacKrell's home to witness firsthand the significant increase in traffic and unfortunately the running of the stop sign and speeding. We have worked with Traffic and Transportation to move the Traffic Smart Cart to critical locations. We have also worked with the Police Department to have radar set up and added additional signage. All of your e-mails and calls were helpful in dealing with these issues.

Unfortunately we are all aware of the new date 11/29 for the partial opening. Nobody is more disappointed than I am. Staff, engineers and the State have all been working with us to get this project completed. With 39,000 cars using this intersection daily, it is critical to get it open as soon as possible.

The group most financially impacted by these delays are the businesses located at 63rd and Grand. Yes, there is no question the traffic issues have been a huge problem but not to the extent the impact has had on the businesses. As a result I have worked with Clear Channel to get free advertising for all of the impacted businesses until Grand is open. A big thank you to Tim Jamison for making this happen. I am also working with Dahl's who has agreed to insert fliers in all customer grocery bags for the impacted businesses. A big thank you to CEO David Sinwell.

Lastly, I have received a number of inquiries as to the condition of the roads and if the City will repair them once the project is completed. We will carefully inspect the various detour routes and make decisions as to how to bring them back to the condition they were in before the project started. We will monitor them closely throughout the project and a final decision will not be made until it is completed. We will keep you posted throughout the next few months.
