Do You Know Your Rights?

Gift Cards-Gift cards have a five-year expiration date. An issuer cannot charge fees for inactivity unless the card has not been used for 12 months.

Identity Theft– f you are a victim of identity theft, do the following: File a police report, report the identity theft to the Federal Trade

Commission at www.consumer.ftc.gov or call the FTC Identity Theft hotline at 877-438-4338, notify the three credit bureaus: Experian, TransUnion, and Equifax and do a fraud alert.

Free Credit Report—Get a free credit report by visiting annualcreditreport.com calling 1-877-322-8228, or by completing the Annual Credit Report Request Form and mailing it to Annual Credit Report Request Service, P.O. Box 105281, Atlanta, GA 30348-5281. You can request a report every 12 months.
