Sustainable Community Designation

During the fall of 2013 CECR, Prince George's County Civic Federation, EDTI, Town of Morningside, and CSCA came together and worked with Maryland Park and Planning Commission and County Council to ensure that a quality application was submitted to Maryland Department of Housing and Community Development, MDHCD. In addition we received written support from several businesses, legislators, and concerned citizens. The package was submitted on February 6, 2014. The approval was issued on May 29, 2014. Below is what was published by MDHCD.

The Greater Camp Springs/Morningside Sustainable Community Area encompasses the incorporated Town of Morningside as well as portions of the unincorporated Camp Springs community. Located adjacent to Joint Base Andrews, it includes one of the state's Base Realignment and Closure zones in addition to the Branch Ave. Metro station, a state-designated Transit Oriented Development zone. Since the majority of the development occurred in this area before the opening of the metro station, Prince George's County plans to focus improvement efforts on facilitating pedestrian access to the metro station. Immediate plans include the addition of pedestrian scale lighting, public art and mural paintings, contrasting sidewalk and crosswalk pavement and constructing a pedestrian refuge. The county will also be supporting the redevelopment of older commercial centers and constructing recreational facilities.

Sustainable Designation—What is Next

Now that we have the designation, we are enhancing the <u>Community Action Plan</u> that CECR submitted. We will be working diligently to prioritize a list of projects and timeline going forward. The initial goal is to revitalize many of the commercial areas within the community. Businesses within the community will encourage growth capital growth.

Within the next few weeks will have community meetings and a workgroup working on the funding opportunities. We encourage all to share their suggestions, concerns and ideas with the workgroup.

Thank you again to all that contributed and supported our efforts for the designation. We are inspired to the unified efforts of the communities going forward.

HISTORY OF THE FEDERATION

The Prince George's County Civic Federation, Inc. traces its roots back to the evening of May 9, 1928, when a small group of citizens gathered at a location near Bladensburg Road. Area homeowners were concerned about the increase in growth in the Washington suburbs. They felt that through a strong alliance they could present a stronger voice in protecting their County from a type and rate of growth that might not be beneficial. Since then, the Federation expanded into a county-wide umbrella organization made up of Civic organizations representing their communities and civic minded individuals. Though land use and the environment continue to be significant, our issues have broadened to include education, public ethics, transportation and taxation. Among our major accomplishments were: creation of the County Hospital and County Service building, a long battle for a Home Rule Charter, the right to vote on bonds and the ethics bill. We assisted the referendum for election of Council members by districts and for term limits.


