



PROPOSED DEVELOPMENT ON LEONHARDT AND RAIL

At our June 9 meeting at 7 PM at the Clubhouse, the owners of Memo Landscaping and Yard Services, a wholesale/retail sales landscaping and lawn care contractor company, their and zoning consultant, Andrew C. Guerrero, will give a brief talk and answer your questions. They have not purchased the property pending your feedback and that of the neighbors in Sierra North. Memo Landscape proposes a rezoning change of a 4.337 acre tract of land at the southeast corner of Rail Drive and Leonhardt Road. Currently the area is zoned C-3 Commercial with an area of I-1 on the rear center portion. The requested change would be to I-1 Light Industrial. Plans are to have their building at the corner of Rail and Leonhardt with one driveway each Leonhardt and Rail with tree landscaping along Leonhardt Road. All equipment and materials will be to the rear.

A cat died and went to heaven. God met the cat at the gate and said, "You've been a very good cat. What would you like? The cat said, "All my life I had to sleep on a very hard floor." God said, "Say no more." Immediately He provided the cat a beautiful large white fluffy pillow. The cat decided

to try it out to take a nap. The next day six mice died and went to heaven. God met them at the gate and said, "You've been very good mice. What would you like? They said, "We've had to run our legs off all our days. We'd like something to make it easier for us to get around." Immediately God provided each mouse with a pair of tiny skates. They were delighted, fastened them on and off they skated.

About a week went by and God went to check on the cat, which was sleeping soundly on the fluffy pillow. He very gently nudged the cat and asked, "How are you? Are you happy here?" The cat yawned and stretched and said, "Yes, this is the best bed I ever had and I love those meals on wheels You've been providing!"



TNR - A City Policy

For 30 years people have been managing the feral cat population by a program called TNR. TNR stands for trap-neuter-return. Cats are humanely trapped, given spay or neuter surgery, vaccinated for rabies, the ear is marked to indicate they are sterile, and they are returned to the location they were trapped.

TNR is endorsed by the ASPCA and the City of San Antonio. It is practiced in other cities including Dallas, Houston, and Austin, and throughout the United States and in other countries.

TNR is more effective at controlling feral cats than removal. Removal fails because of the vacuum effect. Territory that is emptied of feral cats is filled again by cats moving in from the surrounding area, and you are back to Square One.

TNR returns cats to territory they already consider theirs, and they use their instinct to keep other cats out. Fixing them eliminates nuisance behaviors such as spraying, fighting, and yowling. It reduces and stabilizes the population because kittens are not being born.

Here are some ways you can reduce the population of feral cats:

1) Eliminate shelter. Replace the latch on a shed that doesn't close. Fix a broken window. Fill a hole under the foundation that was dug by a skunk (before a pregnant cat finds it and has kittens in your yard). Put away building materials and other items being stored outside (for example plywood or an old door leaning against the garage). Close

A product called Cat Stop, recommended by the feral cat experts, keeps cats out of yards. It is an ultrasonic device with a sensor you stake in the ground. When something breaks the beam it emits an ultrasonic sound for 3 seconds that scares cats away, but is inaudible to humans. It works with either a 9-v battery or a 50-ft power cord. in the crawlspace under a deck. Trim landscaping to keep animals off the roof and out from under bushes. Remove piles of branches that provide habitat for mice and food for feral cats. Look around and think!

- 2) Eliminate water sources. Do not leave things like empty flowerpots outside that will fill with rainwater and provide a place to drink. A hanging birdbath is preferable if you want to provide water for birds but keep cats/possums/raccoons out of it. If you leave water out for your own cat, consider putting it in the garage instead of on the porch.
- 3) Have your family cats spayed and neutered (and vaccinated and microchipped) before letting them outside.
- 4) <u>DO NOT feed any feral cat that is not fixed</u>. In trying to help one hungry cat, you contribute to producing 4 more...that have kittens...that have kittens. Then the original hungry cat is competing with 20 adult offspring for food, shelter, and water. This does not help the original cat. You <u>must</u> stop the breeding. Do your furry friend a real favor and get him or her fixed.

The San Antonio Feral Cat Coalition provides support for TNR. If you attend their 2-hr class, you get a lifetime certificate to spay or neuter feral cats for only \$20. Classes are held at nearby libraries, the San Antonio Humane Society, and Animal Care Services. If you can't do TNR (perhaps you are disabled or don't drive) they provide volunteers to help you. DOG LEASH LAW

There are reports of loose dogs harassing neighbors. The City requires that you keep your dog on a LEASH, if it is not behind a FENCE. If your dog is loose, it could be picked up and impounded. Please be a good neighbor and keep your dog enclosed so that it is not a nuisance to your neighbors.
