There are so many events from the City, that I decided to make this page entirely from things that they offer residents - some old some new. Not all are here, but these are a few I thought of useful.

Textile Recycling - New Program

The City of Mesa is currently piloting a textile recycling program to help repurpose textile materials that have reached their end of life cycle and can no longer be used for their original intended purpose. Mesa residents can recycle their no longer needed textile materials in 3 specially marked clothing and shoe recycle station containers at the following locations.

Dobson Ranch Park, 2363 S. Dobson Road Juanita/Country Club Park & Ride Lot, 1830 S. Country Club Drive

East Mesa Service Center, 6935 E. Decatur St.

Accepted items include: clothing, shoes, linens and towels, hats, purses and belts.

Household Hazardous Waste Events

Mesa residents are invited to bring their no longer wanted household hazardous waste material such as paint, appliances, electronics, propane tanks, pesticides, automotive fluids, batteries, etc. to this event at no

Good Neighbor Guidelines

- 1. Treat others the way you would like to be treated. The Golden Rule is the number one sign of a good neighbor.
- **2.** Know your neighbor's names and phone numbers. This builds friendships and good neighbors.
- 3. Drive at or below the speed limit and come to a complete stop at stop signs. The safety of our children and residents is far more important than getting anyplace else a minute or two sooner.
- 4. Keep your home, yard, and vehicle looking good. This shows respect for your neighbors, increases home values, and beautifies the community. Please keep your grass cut, edge your yard, pick up trash and remove grass growing in the street cracks. Keep your vehicles locked and parked in your driveway. Cars should never be parked on or over sidewalks, which is a violation of city ordinance.
- 5. Consider installing an alarm system or cameras in your home. It increases value in the home and provides safety. Burglar bars decrease value and the resale of your home and your neighbors'.
- **6. Never park in your yard or on grass**. Parking in your yard kills the grass and decreases the appearance and value of your home as well. It is also a violation of city ordinance.
- 7. Don't park boats, non-working vehicles, large truck cabs or trailers on the street. It creates traffic problems and is also a violation of city ordinance.
- 8. Help keep streets free of trash. Garbage pickup is on Saturday, recycle and green barrels is Wednesday.

- Please don't put your garbage can on the street until the night before the scheduled pick up date. Then pull it back to the house when the can is empty. Trash left on the street for several days is a traffic hazard, sets a bad example, and creates a bad image for the entire neighborhood.
- 9. Tell your neighbors when you are going to have a social event at your home. This shows respect. Make sure the noise and music is kept at a minimum.
- **10. Parents** please don't let your young children and teens walk in the street after dark. Also, please teach your children the "Good Neighbor guidelines for Children" listed below.

Good Neighbor Guidelines for Children

- 1. Always treat neighbors, adults and other children with respect.
- 2. Music should be heard in the car, not outside the car.
- 3. Please do not stand in the road when a car is coming. Sidewalks are a safer place to walk.
- 4. Please put your litter in a garbage can, not on the street or sidewalks.
- 5. Please keep school bus stop areas clean. Don't put trash in storm drains.
- 6. Don't invite someone with poor character to visit you. They will bring their poor character and bad habits with them.
- 7. Bad language is never acceptable it's a sign of poor character and upbringing.
- 8. Never enter a neighbor's yard or property unless invited. Basketball hoops may look inviting, but you need an invitation to use them. Please keep personal property in your yard; otherwise, you will need to retrieve it with permission from the homeowner.
