JNA Scholarship Applications Now Being Accepted

Applications are now being accepted for Jefferson Neighborhood Association Evelia Reyna Scholarships. Each year scholarships are given to deserving graduating high school seniors who attend Jefferson High School or whose parents/guardians live within the JNA boundaries, but are attending another high school. The scholarship is named for JNA member Mrs. Evelia Reyna who was an avid supporter of education in our city.

The JNS scholarship committee decides the number and amount of the scholarships awarded each year. The mission of the scholarship program is to support the youth of our community towards achieving their academic goals.

ELIGIBILITY:

- Either attend Jefferson HS or live within the boundaries of the JNA (see page 2 for map) if attending a high school other than Jefferson.
- Be a US citizen.
- Have a GPA of 3.0 (B) or higher.
- Acceptance to any school, college or university.

RESTRICTIONS:

- Awards shall be for tuition, fees and/or books.
- Applications will be accepted from March 1, 2015 through 6:00 PM on May 6, 2015.
- The scholarship committee reserves the right to screen all applicants and to interview the most outstanding candidates in person before a decision is announced.

TO APPLY:

- Complete the application form.
 (downloadable at the JNA websites see page 3)
- Provide proof of GPA.
- Provide a copy of acceptance letter from any school, college or university.
- Write a letter stating why you should receive a scholarship.
 Include your immediate objectives and long-range goals.
 Also include school, church or volunteer activities.
- Submit one letter of recommendation from teachers, religious leaders, volunteer advisors, or community leaders.





For those of you who were not able to attend the District 7 Public Safety Town Hall Meeting held on March 5, here is a brief synopsis:

San Antonio Police Chief Trevino stated that he is focusing on developing a dialogue between SAPD and the community. He makes it a point to attend all new SAPD training classes to directly inform the class of the importance of gaining respect from the community they serve. He mentioned that our neighborhoods continue to have a large SAPD patrol presence and that crime is lower. He also emphasized the importance of joining Next Door.com, a community based media resource, to help keep the neighborhoods safe. Another message is to keep in touch with the SAFFE Officers. Our SAFFE Officer is Marcos Serda and he can be reached at 207-5524 or cell 286-6134.

There was an interesting guest speaker who gave a condensed version of a 40 minute lecture concerning new technology that can determine the location of gunfire within 1 minute. He used Oakland, CA as an example of how gunfire is underreported and the delay time that calls are made. "Sometimes people don't call because they don't want to get involved, or they do not know the direction of the gun shots". He gave several reasons for its use, i.e. locating shell casings that can be used as evidence in solving crimes. The main drawback to this technology is cost. The current price is \$55,000 per square mile annually. It's questionable if the cost warrants consideration for our neighborhood, but other neighborhoods might benefit.

Lisa McKenzie of Graffiti abatement for San Antonio spoke about the latest deterrent on battling graffiti: to plant trees or other greenery near graffiti-plagued walls. She suggested calling 311 to make reports, and to call 911 if you see graffiti in progress.

There was a question and answer session on how to protect ourselves from becoming victims. Sargent Ross suggested taking inventory of our home belongings, locking our doors, using good lighting, looking and seeing if someone is following you when driving. Never go home if you are being followed, instead go to a SAPD substation or go to a well-lit area. Our JNA Facebook tends to keep us well informed. Please continue sharing and reporting anything suspicious to SAPD. You know if there is something suspicious in your neighborhood.

Do You or Someone You Know Reside in the Jefferson Neighborhood Conservation District 7?

Spring is upon us. Landscaping, painting, and remodeling ideas are all swimming throughout our heads. BUT WAIT!! Before you lift that shovel or swing that hammer,

if you live within Jefferson Neighborhood Conservation District (NCD-7) you need to check the design standards laid out in the Jefferson NCD-7 document.

In response to the City's 1997 Master Plan and the 1998 Community Revitalization Action Group Report, the concept of the Neighborhood Conservation District (NCD) was determined to be a proactive tool to address neighborhood sustainability through compatible infill construction and rehabilitation in unique areas of the city. Since the adoption of the NCD enabling ordinance and development of the NCD Program, six NCD Ordinances have been approved by City Council: South Presa Street/South St. Mary's Street (NCD-1), Alta Vista (NCD-2), In-

gram Hills (NCD-3), Whispering Oaks (NCD-4), Beacon Hill (NCD-5), and Mahncke Park (NCD-6).

The Jefferson area neighborhood was selected for designation based on goals identified in the Near Northwest Community Plan, adopted in February, 2004. Section 2.1.5 of the Plan states, "Investigate a Neighborhood

Conservation District for the Deco District area", and Section 3.3.3 states, "Investigate Neighborhood Conservation Districts as a way to protect the architectural character of the neighborhood."

These are the boundaries of JNCD-7: from St. Cloud and Woodlawn north to Babcock, then east to Wilson, then South to Mulberry, then east to Kampmann, then south to Woodlawn, and then west back to St. Cloud.

There have been instances where major remodeling has taken place, guidelines were not followed, and code compliance then required adjustments or complete removal of projects. So it is worth the time to browse through the Jefferson NCD-7 guidelines to check out the do's and dont's of your proposed project. Some projects may require permits, others do not.

If you spot an infraction within the NCD-7 boundaries, please call 311. They will need the address of the location where the possible violation is occurring. You may also call code compliance directly at (210) 207-8237. With everyone's assistance we can help maintain the architectural character and charm of our neighborhood.
