1. Make sure your home has working smoke and carbon monoxide detectors. If you need one you may call **404. 546.7000**

to retrieve one for free or go to our neighborhood fire department on Fairburn Rd

2. Have a family escape plan and ensure that everyone knows how to get out. If there are infants, older adults, or family members with mobility limitations, make sure that someone is assigned to assist them in the fire drill and in the event of an emergency. Assign a backup person too, in case the designee is not home during the emergency.
3. If windows or doors in your home have security bars, make sure that the bars have emergency release devices inside so that they can be opened immediately in an emergency. Emergency release devices won't compromise your security - but they will increase your chances of safely escaping a home fire.
