Just when you think you know everything about your neighborhood, BAM!! enter **Jefferson Thrift Store**, 2002 Bandera Rd in the St John's United Methodist Church complex.

Jefferson Thrift Store is a double treasure, not only will you find great values on collectibles and unique finds; your purchase directly impacts our Jefferson community, as all sales profits go directly to the Jefferson Area Community Outreach.

Opening a thrift store was a logical progression for Jefferson Area Community Outreach, as some of the folks they have helped for the past 35 years have donated belongings which they may no longer be in need of. The store volunteers are so dedicated and helpful; you can feel their commitment to the good works they provide, not only to area seniors, but to others in need of affordable goods.

As a pioneer neighborhood based senior assistance program, Jefferson Area Community Outreach, which helps area residents stay in their homes by providing visits, meals, grocery deliveries and common home repairs, has served as the model for such groups throughout San Antonio. Wayne Thomas, one of the may dedicated volunteers, explained their grocery delivery service; volunteers take orders by phone and deliver the groceries the next day. Our Deco HEB has an employee dedicated to filling these grocery orders, I hear "Ambrosia" is that joyful key person, and 12 to 20 seniors gratefully get their groceries delivered each week.

As you drive to Jefferson Thrift Store, take notice of the marquee. I have enjoyed reading the many inspirational and sometimes fun puns, such as "Can't sleep? Try Counting Blessings", and "Love thy neighbor, even whilst thou drive".

Hello everyone, by the time you receive this note we will have celebrated Fiesta, and I hope everyone had a great time. Last month we held the District 7 Candidate Forum which was successful and soon our newly elected councilperson will be in office.

In the April JNA Newsletter Toni Cadena, Elia Reyna, and Chuck Whitehead, who were on the

2009 Jefferson Neighborhood Conservation District planning team, collaborated in writing an article on our Conservation District. They suggested that before you start renovations, become informed of the design standards laid out in the Neighborhood Conservation District (NCD-7) document*.

Keeping this in mind and with the fact that May is Historic Preservation Month we will have two guest speakers attending our next meeting on May 11. They are **Margaret Pahl**, AICP Senior Planner for the City of San Antonio Development Services Department, and **Allison Smith**, City of San Antonio Office of Historic Preservation. They will present information concerning the guidelines we need to follow.

Our Jefferson neighborhood is comprised of conservation district, historic district, and as yet undesignated areas. At the meeting you will be able to find out about your property's designation. We have well over 2,000 homes in this neighborhood, and I believe you will benefit from the presentation. The floor will be open for questions. If your property is in neither the conservation nor the historic district, your area might be up for review and you may want to find out more about the benefits and responsibilities of being in these districts. You will have a voice in choosing to join or not.

There have been instances when neighborhood residents have had to alter their renovations when the HDRC Board found they had not followed the guidelines.

The following is a quote from the Historic and Design Review Commission: "In considering whether to recommend approval or disapproval of an application for a Certificate of Appropriateness, the HDRC is guided by the Secretary of the Interior's Standards for Rehabilitation, the City of San Antonio's Unified Development Code, and any additional design guidelines adopted by City Council."**

Please join us and become informed. I look forward to seeing you on May 11, 2015, at the Jefferson United Methodist Church across the street from TJHS.

Remember the words of Toni, Elia and Chuck: "BUT WAIT!! Before you lift that shovel or swing that hammer if you live within Jefferson Neighborhood Conservation District (NCD-7) you need to check the design standards". There could be big savings:) or the alternative:(... We want:)

ELIGIBILITY:

- Either attend Jefferson HS or live within the boundaries of the JNA (see page 2 for map) if attending a high school other than Jefferson.
- Be a US citizen.
- Have a GPA of 3.0 (B) or higher.
- Acceptance to any school, college or university.

RESTRICTIONS:

- Awards shall be for tuition, fees and/or books.
- Applications will be accepted from March 1, 2015 through 6:00 PM on May 6, 2015.
- The scholarship committee reserves the right to screen all applicants and to interview the most outstanding candidates in person before a decision is announced.

TO APPLY:


- Complete the application form. (downloadable at the JNA websites listed under JNA Contacts on page 3)
- Provide proof of GPA.
- Provide a copy of acceptance letter from any school, college or university.
- Write a letter stating why you should receive a scholarship. Include your immediate objectives and long-range goals. Also include school, church or volunteer activities.

Progress on the Woodlawn Lake Park and Seeling Channel Projects

After many years and an approved 2012 bond vote of more than \$24 million, the Seeling Channel project is moving full steam ahead. With Phase 1 at Woodlawn Lake Park almost completed, and Phase 2 set to begin right after, the improvements in this area will add much needed drainage and protection to this flood-prone area.

During Phase 1, which spans from Wilson Blvd. to Morning Glory, work involves constructing the concrete channel and improving Wilson Bridge and the storm drain. There will also be a 6-foot safety fence installed along the channel.

Phase 2, one of the largest drainage projects on the schedule for San Antonio's Transportation & Capital Im-

provements Department, will include widening the channel, in addition to improving surrounding streets, bridges, storm drains and utilities. This phase is expected to be completed near December 2016. Phase 3 is not yet funded, but is expected to be covered under a bond proposal in 2017.

Seeling Channel Phase I Work Schedule for the week of April 20, 2015:

- Continue Channel work near Wilson & Mistletoe pouring concrete for the walls.
- · Continue Wilson St. bridge construction
- Continue construction of storm drain on Wilson north of channel.
