

2015 VOLUNTEER IMPACT AWARD WINNERS April was volunteer month. On Thursday, April 9th, Councilwoman Thelda Williams joined Mayor Greg Stanton, City Manager Ed Zuercher and

Leroy Stulce - Leroy currently serves as the chairman of the Black Mountain Community Alliance (BMCA), which he started about three years ago. The BMCA is an all volunteer network of neighbors helping neighbors serving their community. It is an alliance of Block Watch Groups, Phoenix Neighborhood Patrol Groups, Community Groups and HOA's, businesses, schools, city departments with the goal to prevent crime and improve the quality of life within neighborhoods. The mission of the BMCA is to promote the exchange of resources and information that deters crime and secures communities through the development of partnerships with neighborhood organizations and city/county agencies and departments. Leroy believes that Police resources are valuable and that residents can act as the eves and ears of a neighborhood, assisting officers address issues that might otherwise go unnoticed or unreported. His work as a volunteer in his neighborhood, by creating the BMCA has had a positive impact both in the community's relationship with the Police Department and in reducing crime.

#### 2015-2016 IMMUNIZATIONS FOR 6th GRADERS

The following information is very important regarding immunization requirements for the 2015-2016 school year per Arizona School Immunization Law, Article 7, R9-6-701-708:

All students are required to show proof of Chickenpox (Varicella) immunization or to provide a signed history form stating that the student has had Chickenpox.

For the 2015-2016 school year, Arizona School Immunization Law states that all students 11 years of age and older entering the sixth, seventh and eighth grade must have one dose of Meningococcal vaccine (MV). These students are also required to have one dose of Tdap vaccination if five or more years have passed since their last tetanus/diphtheria vaccine dose.

If your child has received the required immunization, please provide the school with documentation (shot records). The record must show the child's name, date of birth, date dose received and physician/health agency that administered the immunization.

If your child has NOT received the required immunization, please contact your physician/healthcare provider or immunization clinic. Information on free immunization clinic sites may be obtained from the school health office.

The schools have advised us that schedules may not be given to students who are not in compliance with vaccinations.






