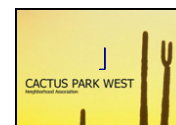

Memorial Day is a [United States federal holiday](#) which occurs every year on the final Monday of May. Memorial Day is a day of remembering the men and women who died while serving in the [United States Armed Forces](#). Formerly known as **Decoration Day**, it originated after the [American Civil War](#) to commemorate the Union and Confederate soldiers who died in the Civil War. By the 20th century Memorial Day had been extended to honor all Americans who have died in all wars. It typically marks the start of the summer vacation season, while [Labor Day](#) marks its end.

Many people visit cemeteries and memorials, particularly to honor those who have died in military service. Many volunteers place an American flag on each grave in national cemeteries.

Rubik's Cube Championships

March ushered in the yearly tradition at ASU West of sponsoring a Rubik's Cube competition for elementary

and high school aged students. The world renowned toy which became a household name has an interesting history. It was originally developed by a Hungarian Sculptor and professor in 1974. He intended it as a demonstration of three-D geometry, but by the 1980's it became a best-selling toy and vexed people world-wide as they twisted and turned the cube.

On March 28th, ten of Moon Valley's students traveled to ASU West to participate in the competition. The eight students and two alternates competed to complete 25 scrambled cubes in the shortest time. Moon Valley's team took 3rd place in the Division 3 competition with a time of 5 minutes and 26 seconds. This was our team's best time so far this year. Two students, Joey Welch and Ariana Gonzalez, also competed in the solo competition. Both completed the Rubik's cube in about 60 seconds. Great job students!

2015 VOLUNTEER IMPACT AWARD WINNERS

April was volunteer month. On Thursday, April 9th, Councilwoman Thelda Williams joined Mayor Greg Stanton, City Manager Ed Zuercher and the members of the Phoenix

City Council for the 2015 Phoenix Impact Volunteer Awards, honoring women and men making a difference through service in our community. Thirty-four dedicated volunteers were honored, including three nominated by Councilwoman Thelda Williams. This past year an estimated 30,000 volunteers contributed more than 500,000 hours to make Phoenix shine! The three exceptional volunteers from District 1 are (as pictured from left to right):

Leroy Stulce - Leroy currently serves as the chairman of the **Black Mountain Community Alliance (BMCA)**, which he started about three years ago. The BMCA is an all volunteer network of neighbors helping neighbors serving their community. It is an alliance of Block Watch Groups, Phoenix Neighborhood Patrol Groups, Community Groups and HOA's, businesses, schools, city departments with the goal to prevent crime and improve the quality of life within neighborhoods. The mission of the BMCA is to promote the exchange of resources and information that deters crime and secures communities through the development of partnerships with neighborhood organizations and city/county agencies and departments. Leroy believes that Police resources are valuable and that residents can act as the eyes and ears of a neighborhood, assisting officers address issues that might otherwise go unnoticed or unreported. His work as a volunteer in his neighborhood, by creating the BMCA has had a positive impact both in the community's relationship with the Police Department and in reducing crime.

Sue Bauer Soto - Sue has served on the Friends of the Phoenix Public Library Board of Directors as Vice President - Branch Relations since 2001. Sue also serves as the President of the Cholla Library Friends Chapter. Sue has volunteered at Cholla since 1994. Sue volunteers about 25 hours per week to Phoenix Public Library. Sue spends approximately 10 hours a month at Cholla mainly assisting with the Friends Book Corner. She also facilitates a monthly Friends meeting for the Cholla Branch. The monies that are raised in the book corner go directly back into programming at Cholla Library. Sue's dedication to volunteerism at the Cholla Library fills a need that assists not only city staff, but our residents who depend on the library for their literary needs.

Bear & Sioux Pooh Muckwa - For the past 18 months Bear has been bringing in his Landseer Newfoundland dog, Sioux Pooh Muckwa, to the Agave Library to let children read to her. Bear and SiouxPooh Muckwa come once a week. After they walk around and visit with children, they settle into a quiet corner and children read to Sioux Pooh Muckwa. While waiting for their turn, they color pictures of dogs.

Sioux Pooh Muckwa is a registered therapy dog and loves spending time with children. This program is a special one, geared for new readers who are not yet confident in their reading skills. They see dogs like Sioux Pooh Muckwa as "safe" and non judgmental about the pace or mispronouncing words. There are children that come every week and wait.

2015-2016 IMMUNIZATIONS FOR 6th GRADERS

The following information is very important regarding immunization requirements for the 2015-2016 school year per Arizona School Immunization Law, Article 7, R9-6-701-708:

All students are required to show proof of Chickenpox (Varicella) immunization or to provide a signed history form stating that the student has had Chickenpox.

For the 2015-2016 school year, Arizona School Immunization Law states that all students 11 years of age and older entering the sixth, seventh and eighth grade must have one dose of Meningococcal vaccine (MV). These students are also required to have one dose of Tdap vaccination if five or more years have passed since their last tetanus/diphtheria vaccine dose.

If your child has received the required immunization, please provide the school with documentation (shot records). The record must show the child's name, date of birth, date dose received and physician/health agency that administered the immunization.

If your child has NOT received the required immunization, please contact your physician/healthcare provider or immunization clinic. Information on free immunization clinic sites may be obtained from the school health office.

The schools have advised us that schedules may not be given to students who are not in compliance with vaccinations.
