Recreational Vehicles Being Stored Properly This Season We Are Good Neighbors

Storage of residents recreational vehicles continues to be an ongoing issue in Columbine West. CWCA acknowledges and thanks those residents who comply with the covenants, which specify that all recreational vehicles must be hidden from view, either in your garage or behind a 6' wooden fence. On the flip side, recreational vehicles parked in driveways and on the street can create problems. Some residents have reported trouble seeing around large recreational vehicles when trying to back out of their driveways. Our neighborhood children who may be on the sidewalk are at greater risk of not being seen, due to sight lines being blocked by large recreational vehicles. Along with the safety factor, parking large recreational vehicles on the street takes up valuable parking space for others, especially those that live in cul-de-sacs. While CWCA covenants state - a recreational vehicle shall not be permitted to remain upon any lot or public continued on page 2

'right of way' either temporarily or permanently unless hidden from view, homeowners are allowed time to load and unload, but should aim to have it completed within a suggested 24 hour time period. Please be considerate and not bring the RV/ trailer out at the beginning of summer and leave it in the driveway or on the street, until the end of that season. If the vehicle is used weekly, limit the loading time to 24 hours, unloading within 24 hours, and store the vehicle properly until used again. It is a pleasure living in Columbine West. Be a good neighbor and respect your neighbors as well as the covenants. The association strives to see our community defined by a sense of shared ownership and collective responsibility. Recycle Your Unwanted Stuff at Dumpster Day & Help Re-Stock Local Food Bank

When: Saturday June 20th, 8 a.m. until 12 noon Where: Church for All Nations, 6500 W Coal Mine Ave. (east of McDonalds). Event entrance is from Marshall St only. Do not enter through McDonalds' driveway.

Cost: FREE if membership dues (check or paypal) received by Thurs. June 15th. *** \$35 for those who pay the day of the event *** Cash or Check Only – No credit cards accepted.

Event is open to Columbine West residents only. Participants must have a picture ID with valid Columbine West address or proof of address from a current Xcel bill.

Food donations of canned goods and non-perishables will benefit the Open Arms Food Bank which serves the Columbine area, so be as generous as possible.

Recycling areas in the order they will be set up are:

- **Document Shredding** All your important personal documents shredded on-site as you watch if you request.
- Metal Recycling metal, aluminum, copper, cords/ strings of lights, automobile batteries, lawn mowers, appliances such as refrigerators, dishwashers, washers/dryers, stoves, and microwaves, as well as barbeques, are all accepted items, and help pay for this event. Make sure gas and oil have been drained from lawn mowers and power tools prior to recycling.
- **Electronic Recycling** TV's, computer monitors, laptops, and hard drives, cell phones, and other electronics will be recycled in an environmentally green way.
- **Trash** anything you would normally take to the dump such as bushes, tree limbs, fencing, furniture, scrap lumber, and mattresses can be dropped off.

No hazardous waste materials will be accepted. This includes paint, chemical products, gas and oil, and propane containers. Clean out your garages, basements and backyards, and get rid of stuff you no longer need or want. Save money and de-clutter in the process. You can make as many trips as necessary within the 4-hour event. Volunteers will be on hand to help you unload. Covenant Violation Reporting Update

CWCA's Covenant Enforcement Committee is currently comprised of a small handful of dedicated resident volunteers and as such there is a limit to what they can accomplish in violation resolution. Due to a lack of volunteers CWCA will no longer be able to accept anonymous covenant violation reports from residents. Residents will need to provide a name, address, and contact information as CWCA frequently needs to get clarification when a complaint is reported. CWCA is sensitive to resident's privacy so no personal information will ever be disclosed outside the CWCA Covenant Enforcement Committee. In the past CWCA was able to be a liaison on behalf of residents when contacting the Sheriff's office or County Zoning. The association regrets they can no longer provide this service until more volunteers are located.

CWCA needs volunteer assistance in verifying and processing covenant and zoning violations. A very few people currently perform these duties and for a neighborhood of 1500 homes there currently is not enough time and hands to ensure adequate and timely enforcement. We need volunteers to assist us with the following:

- Monitoring sectors of the neighborhood for possible violations
- Verification of reported covenant violations
- Follow-up after violation letters have been sent to verify resolution

Volunteers remain anonymous and are not required to be in contact with potential violators. Training will be provided. CWCA is looking for a few good neighbors who are vested in our community. The more we work together, the cleaner and safer our neighborhood will be. Covenant Corner News

We will be highlighting individual covenants in the next several issues of the newsletter. Where appropriate, we will also add related zoning information pertinent to the covenant topic. Covenants are created by the developers who build a neighborhood based on specifications identified in the Official Development Plan (ODP) for that specific area. Zoning regulations are established by the county and are specific to how an area is designated, such as residential, agricultural, commercial, etc. Columbine West is designated Residential R-1. Whenever there is a conflict between the covenant restrictions and zoning regulations, covenants always take precedence over zoning.

Virtually every resident agrees to correct any violations in a timely manner. If you'd like further information or wish to discuss our Covenants, please feel free to attend our monthly Board of Director's meeting. We meet at Dutch Creek Elementary on the 2nd Tuesday of each month at 7:00 p.m. In Summer (June-August) we meet at the Pavilion next to the Pool at 6:30 p.m. - President CWCA







everything looks like when you achieve your goal, the better. See yourself, your surroundings, the people you are with, what you are wearing what you are saying etc. It is a great idea to actually write this out. You may want to create a "vision board" to be placed where you can see it on a daily basis. Knowing why you want the change will assist you in creating enough leverage to inspire you to take action. People want to avoid pain, so pain can be a great motivator. Leverage can be obtained as simply as looking in the mirror and connecting with your frustration or as difficult as a long arduous journey (over months) experiencing the pain and painfully realizing that staying the same is not working for your life. In the second scenario, you get sick enough of it or disgusted enough with it that you (finally) want the change more than anything else.

Next it is important to take immediate action (while pain levels are high) then keep taking consistent action. Consistency is key. Once you take the first step (whatever that is) keep taking steps. Remember, "Progress not perfection". Studies have shown that along the way many very successful people failed a number of times and even wanted to give up but somehow they persevered. It was the perseverance that mattered in the end!

It is often a good idea to track your journey and to have someone to be accountable to along the way. There is power in the spoken and the written word. I find that putting pen to paper makes everything more real. If I share my tracker with someone, it becomes solidified. If someone is there to give you encouragement and to remind you why you are doing this you will be reinvigorated. Also, when you start to slip, you will get back on track faster if someone can nudge you in the right direction. It is so easy to get distracted or lose momentum all on your own.



Last week I was in Atlanta, Georgia attending a conference. While I was in the airport, returning home, I heard several people behind me beginning to clap and cheer. I immediately turned around and witnessed one of the greatest acts of patriotism I have ever seen. Moving through the terminal was a group of soldiers in their camos. As they began heading to their gate, everyone (well almost everyone) was abruptly to their feet with their hands waving and cheering. When I saw the soldiers, probably 30-40 of them, being applauded and cheered for, it hit me. forth on it. After about 10-15 seconds, the young soldier walked back over to Courtney, bent down and said, 'I spoke to your daddy and he told me to give this to you.' He hugged this little girl that he had just met and gave her a kiss on the cheek. He finished by saying 'your daddy told me to tell you that he loves you more than anything and he is coming home very soon.' The mom at this point was crying almost uncontrollably and as the young soldier stood to his feet, he saluted Courtney and her mom. I was standing no more than 6 feet away from this entire event. As the soldiers began to leave, heading towards their gate, people resumed their applause. As I stood there applauding and looked around, there were very few dry eyes, including my own. That young soldier in one last act of selflessness, turned around and blew a kiss to Courtney with a tear rolling down his cheek.

We need to remember everyday all of our soldiers and their families and thank God for them and their sacrifices. At the end of the day, it's good to be an American.
